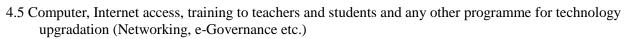

The Principal has brought these things to the notice of the Governing Body and Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. It is expected that the management will take note of requirement of the college and necessary action will be taken.

BEST PRACTICE-I

1. Title of the Practice:

Expansion & renovation of Institutional Infrastructure by Cross Subsidization.

2. Objective of the Practice:

To tide over constricted institutional exchequer for resource mobilization in order to ensure the availability of infra structural facilities to serve the purpose of advancement in Curricular Management. Strategy for this objective emphasizes upon the up gradation of existing system in adherence to modifications of practical components in the Science and Commerce Streams with stated reference to introduced semester system by the University of Calcutta.

3. The Context:

Two In house Distance Education Centres affiliating to Vidysagar University & Netaji Subhas Open University remain operational at the weekend and at scheduled holidays under the overall supervision of Principal with assigned responsibility of coordinating to two Faculties of the College.

The accounting systems of these two Distance Education Centres are being conjoined but not integrated to mainstream account portfolio in order to discern the scope of fund disposal for the objective as being profiled above as also to maintain the accountability of fiscal portfolios by placing them to a singular D.D.O. the Principal.

4. The Practice:

Simultaneous operation of Regular and Distance Education catalyzes both resource mobilizations as also scope for interface with eminent faculties attached to both the sectors. As the Distance Education under Vidyasagr University harbours Post Graduate Course therefore University Faculties generally teach there. Acquaintance to them helps the institution to involve their eminent faculties for relevant UG Courses.

Constraint in accommodating other science subjects available by these Distance Education mode consequent upon non availability of infra structural facility for them in the mainstream curricular system liable to the affiliation constraints to University of Calcutta forbids the expansion of the scope for their further expansion as also garnering auxiliary resource prospect.

5. Evidence of Success:

The hinterland of this college is infested by Urban and rural households with constricted financial capacity. Therefore to comply the challenge of providing quality curricular management essentially oriented to renewed yet augmented provision of infra-structure. To accomplish the purpose assured disbursement of financial provision from institutional sector is required to be contained.

The referred curricular infra-structure reorientation is the tangible evidence of accomplished subjects. It is deemed worthy to submit that ancillary financial support from RUSA and Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal also helped substantially for organized and planned development of Infra structure development of College.

6. Problems Encountered and Resource Required:

Regular expansion of infra-structure along with provision of faculties are the collateral prerequisites for ensuring quality in Higher education. Faculty recruitment is prerogative of Department of Higher Education, Government of west of West Bengal for which consistent and relentless striving is going on. The transition span to the availability of a full time

faculty is to be supplemented by Guest Faculty with financial support from institution.

As a consequence College has to fulfill the responsibility of both the maintenance of quality teaching and assured Infra structure preferably with ICT enabled system. Fund Fluctuation stemming from oscillations in the intake level in the Distance Education Portfolio results in the uncertainty to the anticipated fund availability. Alternatively demands for admission cannot be fulfilled due to paucity of spatial accommodation.

1. TITLE OF THE PRACTICE:-

COMMUNITY SERVICE THROUGH NSS UNIT

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE PRACTICE:-

As a Unit of National Service Scheme of the University of Calcutta, the students of Dr.Kanailal Bhattacharyya College have dedicated themselves towards the glorious aim of serving the nation. The motto of NSS --- 'NOT ME BUT YOU' has constantly driven them to carry out their duties to the nation throughout the year. The main objectives of the practice is to ----

- a) Working with the people and for the people.
- b) Expanding one's knowledge into the community.
- c) Finding the practical implication of one's theoretical knowledge.
- d) Achieving the potential of democratic leadership.
- e) Bridging the gap between the educated and the uneducated.
- f) Channelizing one's knowledge and skill to assist the weaker section of the society.

3. THE CONTEXT:

With the dawning of Independence on 15th August, 1947, The Government of India intended to integrate the student community in the service of the nation. As a result all the Universities and Colleges have set up their NSS Unit to ensure the community service. The students of Dr.Kanailal Bhattacharyya College also dedicated themselves in various community services. They regularly organised Medical Health check-up camp, Blood Donation Camp, AIDS awareness camp in local slum areas. On 26th March, 2018 the IQAC, NSS Unit, Students Union and Alumni Association jointly organised a Blood Donation Camp with the help of Bhoruka Blood Bank, Kolkata.

4. THE PRACTICE:-

Community service through NSS Unit is a part of all Higher Education Institutions. Our College have also NSS Unit. There are 100 volunteer of this unit. The volunteers are participated to the community services. They conducted Blood donation camp and medical camp. But it is difficult to motivate most of the students to this service. In the system of Higher Education and examination it is difficult to manage time for arrangement of outdoor camp. Limitation of funds is also a constraint to serve the community requirement.

5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:-

Our NSS Unit regularly organised community service activity throughout the year. Many of the students donated blood, helped the flood affected people. In the Blood Donation Camp on $26^{\rm th}$ March, 2018 there are 45 students donated blood.

6. PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOURCES REQUIRED:-

Limitation of fund is main problem of this practice. If Govt. of India sanctions more funds for NSS Unit to serve the community then it will be more fruitful.
