

## Instructions to Students

1. First year students are hereby instructed to sign in the University of Calcutta Check List from the date of commencement of BA/B.Sc./B.Com classes within two months and also to fill up C.U. Registration Form, failing which, C.U. Registration can not be issued for the absentance students.
2. If a student fails to substantiate the information submitted during admission for the purpose of fulfilling the formalities for obtaining University of Calcutta Registration or for any other purpose the college finds appropriate, his/her admission would be cancelled.
3. The undersigned is directed to forward you the University Notifications No. CSR/3/18, dt. 07.05.2018 and CSR 4/18, dt. 07,2018, containing new Admission & Examination Regulations for Semester-wise three-year (six semesters) B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General) and B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Major) Courses of studies under CBCS and B.Com CSR 64/17 dt 14/9/17 & CSR 10/18 dt. 30/05/2018

This new Admission and Examination Regulation is in effect from the academic session, i.e., 2018-2019.

The 3 year B.A/B.Sc. (Honours/General) Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (6) consecutive semesters of six (6) months each i.e., three (3) years. The Odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year under CBCS (Choice-based Credit System) university of Calcutta.

A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for three-year semester-wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of five years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

### 4. Applicability of the Regulation

These regulations shall be applicable to :

- a. The students who are taking admission to the B.A/B.Sc. (Honours/General)( Course from the academic session 2018-2019.
  - b. The students who were admitted a earlier sessions but did not enroll for B.A./B.Sc/ B.Mus. (Honours/General) Part I Examinations up to 2018.
  - c. The students who were admitted in earlier sessions and enrolled for B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General) Part I Examinations did not appear in Part I Examinations up to 2018,
  - d. The students who were admitted in earlier sessions and appeared in B.A./B.Sc/ B.Mus.(Honours/General) Part I Examinations in 2018 or earlier shall continue to be guided by the existing Regulations of Annual System.
5. It is compulsory for the students of B.A./B.Sc./ Hons. Gen 1st yr (Sem 1 and Sem 2) and B.Com 2nd year (Sem 3 and Sem 4) to appear for internal assessment. B.A./B.Sc. 2nd year and 3rd yr. and B.Com 3rd year as per University Calendar.

6. Students enrolling for the honours course cannot change their given subject combination, as mentioned in the prospectus.
7. Availing the library facility is mandatory for all students.
8. College fees are to be deposited on time. College fees are to be deposited through online mode at the time of starting of each Semester i.e.,

Sem-I, Sem-III & Sem-V => July every year (Total Annual Fees)

Sem-II, Sem-IV & Sem-VI => January every year (Tuition Fees only)

9. College campus and class rooms should be kept clean.
10. Cycles are to be kept in the cycle stand alone and nowhere else.
11. Under no circumstances, the discipline and the academic atmosphere can be violated.
12. NO STUDENTS WILL BE ALLOWED to enter the college Campus WITHOUT THEIR IDENTITY CARD.

### Rules Regarding Admission

- a) For admission to the Honours courses the minimum marks to be obtained in the H.S. examinations is 50% and 45% in the desired subject or 55% in the desired subject (best of 4).
- b) Admission in U.G. Colleges of C.U. will be on the basis of College level on-line admission procedure introduced by the Calcutta University from 2015-16 academic session.

### Attendance

- a) A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes [60% to less than 75% = 6, 75% to less than 90% = 8, 90% and above = 10] held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Examinations.
- b) A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes\* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- c) A student attending at least 60% shall not be allowed appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he/she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year.

## Code of Conduct for (Students)

1. Students must abide by all the rules and regulations set by the college and the university

In addition 4 Core Courses to be studied, two courses each from two language subject. I.C.C.I. English & ICC2- MIL (Bengali/Hindi/ Urdu)/Alternative English as specified for each of the last 4 semesters.

#### LCC -2 - Bengali/Communicative English Discipline Specific Elective

- Modalities of selecting DSE by a student of Honours/General programme shall be as follows :
  - a) In case of B.A./B.Sc. Honours Programme a student shall have to study 4 DSE courses strictly on the Honours subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE on the Honours subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.
 

**Explanation :** Each Honours subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall choose any one paper from each of Group A and Group B in fifth semester and sixth semester.
  - b) In case of B.A General programme, a student shall have to study 4 DSE courses strictly on 2 subjects opted for Pursuing Core Courses, taking exactly 2 Courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester. i.e., DSE-A in the 5th and DSE-B in 6th semester.
 

**Explanation :** Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the two subjects the fifth semester and one paper from Group B of each of the two subjects in the sixth semester'.
  - c) In case of B.Sc. General programme, a student shall have to study 6 DSE courses strictly on 3 subjects, opted for pursuing core courses, taking exactly two courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of DSE of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester, i.e., DSE-A in the 5th and DSE-B in 6th Semester.
 

**Explanation :** Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of DSE papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the three subjects in fifth semester and one paper from Group B of each of the three subjects in the sixth semester'.

- **Dissertation/Project** : An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, is termed as dissertation/ project. This is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/analyzing/exploring a real life situation/ difficult problem. A dissertation/project work will be of 6 credits. A dissertation/project work may be given in lieu of a Discipline Specific Elective.

(ii) **Generic Elective (GE) Course** : An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek wide exposure, is called Generic Elective.

**N.B.** : A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective. [A core course (CC) of B.A./B. Sc General will be treated as Generic Elective for B.A./B. Sc. (Honours) and B.A. (General)]

**Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)** : May be of two kinds : Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

- a) **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** : AECC courses are courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

- i) AECC1 : Communicative English/MIL (Bengali/Hindi/Urdu)
- ii) AECC2 : Environmental Studies.

- b) **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** : These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills, etc.

- **Modalities of selecting SEC by a student of Honours/ General programme shall be as follows:**

- a) In case of B.A./B.Sc./B.Mus. Honours programme a student shall have to study 2 skill enhancement courses strictly on the Honours subjects. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC on the Honours subjects concerned as specified for the relevant semester, i.e., SEC-A in the 3rd semester and SEC-B in the 4th semester.

**Explanation** : Each Honours subject shall have two groups (A & B) of Skill Enhancing Course papers. An Honours student shall have to choose one paper from Group A in third semester and one paper from Group B in fourth semester.

- b) In case of B.A. General programme, a student shall have to study 4 Skill Enhancement courses strictly on 2 subjects, opted for pursuing Core Courses, taking exactly 2 courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.

**Explanation** : Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of SEC papers. A student shall have to choose one paper from Group A of each of the (two core subjects) in the third and fifth semesters and one paper from Group B of each of the (two core subjects) in the fourth and the sixth semester.

- c) In case of B.Sc. General programme, a student shall have to study 4 Skill Enhancement courses strictly on 2 subjects out of the three, opted for pursuing core courses, taking exactly two courses from each subject. Such a student shall have to study the curriculum of SEC of the subject concerned as specified for the relevant semester.

**Explanation :** Each General subject shall have two groups (A & B) of SEC papers. One paper from Group A of each of the two Core subjects to be chosen in the third and fifth semester; one paper from Group B of each of the two core subjects to be chosen in the fourth and sixth semester.

**Practical/ Tutorial :** Every Core, Discipline\_Specific and Generic\_Elective course shall have a Practical/ Tutorial component. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and Vice versa.

**Physiology :** A candidate shall be allowed to semester-wise Honours in Physiology if he/ she has passed the subject Physiology/Biology/Bio-Technology and Chemistry in the previous qualifying examination. The subject Biology/Bio-Technology may be treated as the related subjects.

## Examination Regulations

- The 3 year B.A./ B.Sc. (Honours and General) Course of Studies under CBCS shall consist of six (6) Semesters (Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester -V and Semester -VI).
- End Semester Examination are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester i.e. Semester-I, Semester-III, Semester-V, in December - January and Semester-II, Semester-IV, Semester- VI, in June-July.
- End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal Assessment (i.e. 10 marks for a full paper of 100 or 5 marks for a Module of 50, as the case may be) will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% will be assessed based on the class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% of above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered ; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later.

The students are to be informed about the modalities of internal assessment well in advance.

- A candidate pursuing Honours Course of Study has to secure 30% marks (excluding the marks in Internal Assessment) separately in Theory and Practical/Tutorial part of each paper, wherever applicable, at the End Semester Examination, and a minimum of 30% marks in each paper (including marks in Internal Assessment) in order to earn the corresponding credit of the concerned paper and a minimum of CGPA 4.000 (including Internal Assessment) taking all the papers of all the Semesters as a whole, i.e. all CC, DSE, SEC, GE & AECC papers, in order to get the Honours Degree.

- If a candidate pursuing Honours Course of Study has to secure 30% marks (excluding the marks in Internal Assessment) separately in Theory and Practical/Tutorial part of each paper, wherever applicable, at the End Semester Examinations, and a minimum of 30% marks in each paper (including marks in Internal Assessment) but fails to secure a minimum of CGPA 4.000 (including Internal Assessment) taking all the papers of all the Semesters as a whole, i.e. all CC, DSE, SEC, GE & AECC papers, will get the General Degree.
- A candidate pursuing General Course of Study has to secure 30% marks (excluding the marks in Internal Assessment) separately in Theory and Practical/Tutorial part of each paper, wherever applicable, at the End Semester Examinations and a minimum of 30% mark in each paper (including marks in Internal Assessment) in order to earn the corresponding credit of the concerned paper and to get the General Degree.
- A candidate who is eligible to appear at any of the End Semester Examinations does not enroll or does not appear at the examinations or fails to secure pass marks in the paper(s) at the concerned examinations, as stated in Clauses 19.1, 19.2, 19.3 above, as well as a candidate not eligible to appear at the end semester examination, as stated in Clause 6 will be allowed to attend the classes in the next higher semester, as applicable.
- Internal Assessment has to be done in the semester in which a candidate becomes eligible to appear in the concerned End Semester Examination. The candidates remaining absent in the internal examination will be awarded zero (0) marks. Marks obtained in Internal Assessment (i.e. marks for attendance and marks of internal examination taken together) shall be retained for the entire duration of his/her enrolment.
- If a candidate secures pass marks in Practical Paper (s)/ Module (s)/Project Work/Tutorial but fails to secure pass marks in Theoretical paper (s)/ module, the marks of Practical Paper (s)/ Module (s)/ Project Work/ Tutorial along with Internal Assessment shall be retained.
- A candidate may appear at any higher End Semester Examination without appearing at lower End Semester Examinations subject to Clause 6.
- A candidate may continue his/her course of study for the next higher Semester without appearing at the lower End Semester Examinations subject to Clause 6.
- A candidate who fails to secure pass marks (as stated in Clauses 19.1, 19.2, 19.3 above) in one or more papers of a semester may appear in those paper (s) when the concerned End Semester Examinations will be held next.

In this regard I am further directed to say that reservation of seats shall not exceed 45% (Sc-22%, ST-6%, OBC-A-10%, OBC-B-7%) . Persons with disabilities will enjoy a 3% reservation in each of the categories, i.e. in SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B and in the Unreserved or General Category, and such candidates, if available, shall be placed towards the top of the list prepared for each category of students.

## BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

It had been a long cherished dream of the people of Santragachi to have a degree college in their locality. The dream gradually turned into a demand. At this turn, certain events also coincided. Late Sudhir Kumar Ghosh decided to donate his land and the building situated at Dharmatala in Ramrajatala. After that with the initiative of the then local MLA Sri Satyen Ghosh and some important persons of the area, a trustee was formed before setting up the college. It was 26th November, 1984. On 10th March, 1985 in a public meeting presided over by Late Raghudas Baul and attended by Late Sudhir Kumar Ghosh, the college was named after the leading educationist, respected public leader and ex-minister of Industry and Commerce (Govt. of W. B.), Late Professor Dr. Kanailal Bhattacharyya.

Before the commencement of fund raising programmes, a nine-member committee was set up with the then District Magistrate of Howrah Sri Sumanta Chowdhury as the President of the same. Some local bodies and many education lovers came in with monetary help. Under the leadership of the noted engineer Late Raghudas Baul, a group of dedicated engineers came forward to lay down the plan and supervise the reformation of the old building and to establish new classrooms. With their cumulative support the old building was repaired and extended as per the need. Two new class rooms were also set up.

In the month of September 1985, the college received permission to organize courses in five subjects – Bengali, English, History, Philosophy and Education from Calcutta University. On 22nd September 1985, the college was officially inaugurated by Late Prof. Sambhu Ghosh, the then Honourable Minister of Higher Education of Govt. of West Bengal. With the setting up of the institution, the coveted dream of many a people was realized.

From September 1985 to January 1988, as the Founder Secretary, the then local MLA Sri Satyen Ghosh led the development and the management of the college. In December 1985, Sri Keshab Chandra Khanra joined the institution as the first permanent lecturer in the Bengali department. He temporarily shouldered the responsibility of the post of the Teacher-in-charge from 11th September 1986 to 19th January 1988. On 20th January 1988, Sri Nripendranath Bhattacharya joined as the permanent Principal. With the permanent Principal, the overall activity of the institution received a fresh new start.

## Brief history of the College Major Achievements

### LATE NRIPENDRA NATH BHATTACHARYYA

(January 1988 – May 1998)

Shri Nripendranath Bhattacharyya an eminent scholar of Bengali Literature joined as the first Principal of our College on 20th January, 1988. The institution received a new impetus under his guidance and action.

#### Major achievements :

1. Fund raising programmes through state govt permitted lottery and charity show by Mamata Shankar Ballet Troupe for setting up of New College building and extension of the old one.
2. New land acquisition for the construction of the Science Block.
3. Enlisting the College as Govt aided College under (Sec) 2(1) and 12(b) of UGC vide order no 8-48/87 dated 22nd October, 1994.
4. Commencement of the Commerce Department from the academic session 1995-96
5. Instrumental in introducing Honours courses in Bengali Education, History and Political Science.
6. Extension of the Main Building to the second floor from the grant of Rs. 3.17 lakhs under MPLAD and a further donation of 17000 from HOWRAH MUNICIPAL CORPORATION.

### DR. DILIP KUMAR SAHOO

(December 1993, July 2016)

Dr Dilip Kumar Sahoo joined College on 1st Decembor, 1999. Much of the development work was initiated and completed during his tenure.

#### Major achievements :

1. Construction of the ground floor of the science block began in the year 2000 with the MPLAD grant 10 lakhs and the 1st floor in 2003 Later on the 2nd and the 3rd floor was completed under various Grants of Govt. of West Bengal and MPLAD schemes.
2. The vision of constructing Womens Hostel was realised with the UGC grant of 30 lakhs in the first phase in 2001 and later 72 lakhs in the second phase in the year 2007.
3. From a small single room library he constructed a spacious library for students with internet facility in 2001.
4. He started the UGC approved Remedial Coaching for slow learners and backward categories from 2001 and Short Term Vocational Training interior Decoration and Automobile Engineering under West Bengal State Council to equip the students with professional training It is still fully operative and large number of students have benefited from the scheme.
5. He introduced self-funded general course in Geography which later was approved by Dept. of Higher Education in 2003. Honours course was introduced from 2006.

6. In 2004 the college participated in the NAAC assessment (National Accreditation Assessment Council) and became the first College in Howrah to achieve the laurel by securing C++. The College later on participated in two more cycles of NAAC successfully in the year 2009 securing GRADE C and 2014 securing GRADE B.
7. He introduced 'Career Oriented Vocational Scheme' under UGC from 2004 with the grant of 10 lakhs. Not only this, he was instrumental in introducing UGC approved 'Entry into Service Scheme' and Equal Opportunity Centre' from 2009.
8. Under the 10th plan of UGC grant of 7 lakhs New Building and Boys' common room was constructed in place of the old store room in the main campus.
9. He always encouraged research activities among faculties and students During his tenure 11 UGC sponsored seminars both at the State National and International level was organized and seven Minor Research Projects funded by UGC also completed.
10. He introduced subjects of Botany, Physiology and Zoology first as general course in 2008 and later Honours course was also introduced in the year 2012.

## INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE (ICC)

### Convener : Prof Sipra Ganguly

The Supreme Court of India in a landmark judgement in August 1997 (Vishakha & others VS State of Rajasthan & others), stated that every instance of Sexual Harassment is a violation of "Fundamental Rights" under Articles 14, 15, 21 of the Constitution of India & amounts to a violation of the Right to Freedom under Article 19(1)(g).

The government of India accordingly enacted the Sexual Harassment of Women at workplace (prevention prohibition and redressal) Act 2013. The Act is an extension of the Vishakha Guideline issued by the Supreme Court in 1997.

In compliance with UGC Guidelines, Dr Kanailal Bhattacharyya College constituted an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC). It seeks to address protection against gender discrimination and sexual harassment of women in the college campus, prevention and redressal of such complaints and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. ICC will be responsible for the redressal of complaints made by women teachers, women non-teaching staff and girl students to ensure time-bound treatment of the complaints as provided in the Act.


