#### EVALUATIVE REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF BENGALI

The Department of Bengali was established in 1985 at the time of first affiliation of the college by University of Calcutta. At first, courses in Compulsory Bengali and Elective Bengali in the B.A. stream was introduced. Bengali honours was introduced in 1998 with 25 seats. It was Herculean task for the teachers- one full time and two part-time to bear with excess class load at that time. But with the full sincerity and devotion, the result was above 95% all the time. The intake capacity of Honors students was increased to 50 in the year 2000. It was increased to 75 in 2008. Dr.Mantu Biswas joined the second post (reserved for SC) in May 2005.

Students fulfilling the minimum eligibility criteria as determined by CU from time to time are given admission to the first year Bengali honours. The honors students of Geography, Philosophy, History, Political Science and Education can opt for Bengali General. Students taking admission in the General Courses can opt for Bengali as a General subject.

Students come from mediocre and poor families of the area and of distant villages. They do not possess sound academic background. So the teachers of the Department take care for the academic improvement of these students. The result of the students in the CU examination is satisfactory.

CU. frames the Syllabus for the honors and General courses. The UG council of the University changes it from time to time. The drop-out rate of the admitted students is 5% to 10% in average. Library facilities are easily available to the students. The college library has 1616 books for the use of the students of Bengali. Some relevant audio-CDs are used for the academic interest of the students. Teachers are very cooperative towards the students' necessities providing books, journals and study materials. The First and Second Year students of the department publish wall magazines of the department separately each year. The department organizes educational tours from time to time. A teacher exchange programme was organized with Joypur Panchanan Roy College, Howrah in the current academic session. Teachers of the department attend state - level and national level seminars organized by other colleges and Universities. There is no formal placement cell, Guidance is given to the students to provide services to the public sector, SSC and various competitive examinations. We cherish to introduce PG course in Bengali under CU in the future.

## EVALUATIVE REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

#### 1. Faculty Profile

The faculty of the English Dept. consists of one (1) full time senior lecturer, Prof. Swati Mustaphi and one(1) part time lecturer in the form of Prof. Saranya Sen. Prof. Mustaphi. after completing her honors program in English under University of Calcutta from St. Xavier's College went on to do her M.A. and M.Phil. from Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi securing first class in both. She cleared UGC-NET examination in 1996 and was awarded the Junior Research Fellowship. She joined the present college as Lecturer in English on 01.11. 2000. She has completed two Refresher Courses in English from Jadavpur University in the years 2005 and 2009. She has several presentations of seminar papers to her credit and has attended quite a few national and international level seminars and workshops. Details of such papers are in the Evaluative Report of the college. She has the responsibility of the majority of the classes taken along with other co-curricular activities in the department. She had been instrumental in bringing in the system of written entrance examination in the department that has generated significant interest among the aspiring candidates. Prof S.Mustaphi was officer-in-charge of Calcutta University Partl Examinations, 2005. She was also the member of the Selection Committee held on 17.12.08 for the appointment of a part-time teacher in the Department. Prof S Mustaphi has a First Class Masters' Diploma in Rabindrasangeet from Bangiva Sangeet Parishad.

Prof. Saranya Sen, part-time lecturer in English joined the Department on 02.01.2008. He did his honors in English from St. Xavier's College under the University of Calcutta in 2005 and his M.A. from the same university in 2007 with a first class. He cleared the State-level Eligibility Test (SET) for lectureship in 2008. Currently he is pursuing M.Phil. Program from the University of Calcutta. He has presented papers in the state level seminars and has written articles in Bengali and English magazines and journals. The students with interest and active interactions attend his classes. Currently the Editor of the journal of the English department, he is significantly contributing to the academic atmosphere of the institution.

The department was established in 1985. The Honours programme was initiated in the academic session 2003-04 with an intake capacity of ten students. The intake capacity for honors was increased to twenty-five from the academic session 2007-08. The department is seriously understaffed and the effect of it can be seen in the form of the added pressure that the existing faculty has to shoulder. Though there is the recommendation of five (5) more full-time teaching posts, the W.B. College Service Commission has not managed to appoint anyone in them so far. At present, two teachers have to cater to around 450 students (Honours and Compulsory English).

#### 2. Student Profile

The students of the department mainly come passing the Higher Secondary Examination organized by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education. For most of the students, the medium of instruction in school was Bengali, which has left them with immense scope to improve their English language skills as well as their style of English writing. However, to ensure the basic literary and linguistic competence required in an honors level class, the department has started organizing entrance examinations for the candidates aspiring to take admission. The entrance test was held on 18.6.08. There were 117 applicants for the 25 honors seats. The selected candidates have shown considerable

improvements in the first year of their study as well. They have contributed to the departmental journals some well-researched articles and in the form of the departmental wall magazine (Miscellanea) have showcased their creative drives. Further, in the departmental seminar they have spoken at length on various topics starting from the element of queer in Shakespeare to the linguistic power politics in Blake. Thus their research orientation, imaginative enterprise and the speaking proficiency has shown marked improvement. And the faculty of the department may humbly claim the responsibility of that. Further, the students themselves have been quite enthusiastic in their academic endeavor. They have enrolled themselves as members in the organization like the British Council Library along with utilizing the college library to its fullest.

3 to 5. Changes made in the courses, students' performances and library facilities of the department.

The University of Calcutta initiated the major syllabus revisions in the academic session 2008. The students have performed considerably well in the CU examinations. The department makes use of the college library. At present the English Department library has 525 books of which, 70 books are from the Minor Research Project grant of Prof Swati Mustaphi.

6. Modern Teaching Methods Practiced & the Use of ICT in Teaching-Learning

The teaching program of the department is saved in the form of a power point presentation. Several classes are organized with the help of power point. The students are encouraged to refer to the e-sources while researching on their course program. They are provided with several useful links to help them in their study.

7. Participation of the teachers in academic and personal counseling of students

The faculty of the department has a tradition of intimate contact with the students. While the student-teacher interaction in the class is satisfactory, the faculty takes extra care to locate the problems of every single student and suggest the remedy. The students feel absolutely free to contact the teachers outside the classrooms. The department has taken further initiative to connect to the guardians of the students through parents-teacher meetings.

8.Details of faculty development programmes.

Prof Swati Mustaphi attended the Management Development Programme on Excellence in Higher Education at Indian Institute of Management, Calcutta from 04.08.2008 to 06.08.2008.

Prof Swati Mustaphi attended a Refresher course as a Senior Lecturer on Literature and Thought at Jadavpur University from 02.02.2009 to 21.02.2009

- Participation/Contribution of teachers to the academic activities including teaching, consultancy and research
- a) Prof. Saranya Sen takes 12 classes per week (9 honors classes, 2 general classes, ICompulsory English Class)
- b) He is currently pursuing M.Phil. Program from the University of Calcutta. The topic of his research is 'Nationalism in the novels of Chinua Achebe'.
- c) Prof Swati Mustaphi takes 22 honors classes per week, 01 Compulsory English class and 02 classes for General English.
- d) Prof Swati Mustaphi worked on a Minor Research Project entitled The Philosophy of Language in the Novels of Anita Desai from April 2005 to May 2007. The total approved and sanctioned amount for the Project is Rs 50000/-.

f) Prof. Swati Mustaphi, presented a paper entitled: The Meaning of Meaning: Bhartrhari's Sphota Theory in the Refresher Course on Literature and Thought at Jadavpur University in February 2009.

Prof. Swati Mustaphi's research priorities are Comparative Poetics and Indology.

12. Placement record of the past students

There is an unofficial record of past students showing vertical mobility towards postgraduate programmes. Some students have found placements as assistant teachers in government- aided schools after graduation. However, a complete database is not available due to the lack of an adequate infrastructure.

13 Plan of action of the department for the next five years.

The present faculty of the Department of English has strong research orientations. Due to the lack of time and infrastructure the faculty is engaged in teaching for most part of the time. The faculty would like to conduct more research projects with government grant. The department would also like to purchase more books out of an increased fund allocation. Finally, the teachers of the department would like to function as placements' officers for their own students with UGC aid.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The vision of Dr Kanailal Bhattacharyya College, Howrah lies in providing quality higher education to the learners who mostly come from Santragachi and adjoining areas of Howrah district. The vision also lies in providing employability to these students belonging to the middle and lower- middle classes. The mission therefore, is to introduce a few short-term job-oriented programmes. During the past five years after accreditation in April 2004, the college has introduced a number of joboriented programmes in the form of six UGC add-on courses and three vocational courses approved by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training, Government of West Bengal. The counselling cell has continuously encouraged students to obtain placements in various companies. The college has become an associate of Retail Career to provide students with on-the-job training. Students passing out of the Degree Programmes and those pursuing the vocational certificate courses are equally encouraged to face campus interviews for placements. The college has submitted a proposal to UGC for the setting up of a Cell for Career and Counselling. The government has not sanctioned the post of the placements' officer. The management of the college would request the NAAC authorities to recommend the creation of the post of a placements' officer,

As part of its Extension Activities, the college organized the UGC sponsored Computer Awareness Program for the teachers of local schools. The college conducted the slum area literacy program for the primary education of slum children with UGC assistance. Again, with UGC assistance, Remedial Coaching Classes for the economically and academically backward students (SC/ST/OBC/Minorities) were held during the academic session 2008-09. A health camp was organized in the college on 06.1.09 benefitting the girl students of local schools.

The students' enrolment in Degree Programs has almost doubled itself over the last five years. The University of Calcutta has increased the intake capacity for all the honours subjects in order to cope with the rising demands of the students. The Biological Sciences stream has started functioning. The overall pass percentage of the students in the Calcutta University examinations is over 95%. The college has initiated a few classes per week on value-based education.

The college is yet to open up multiple avenues for research. In the Department of English one Minor Research Project has been completed. The college is doing collaborative research with the Institute of Folklore and Cultural Studies, Kolkata. A few teachers have been awarded MPhil and PhD degrees. A few other teachers are pursuing their research programmes. With the opening up of a few PG programmes in the NSOU study centre of the college and the Distance Education programme under Vidyasagar University, it is expected that more possibilities of research would gradually open up.

The college received a quantum of grants for infrastructure augmentation. Accordingly, quite a few college buildings, workshops and laboratories have been added to the infrastructure over the last five years. ICT is being gradually introduced in order to achieve a synchrony between all the administrative processes. However, the introduction of ICT in the teaching - learning process is not easy with most of the students coming from the economically weaker sections. As a result, the women's hostel constructed under the UGC IX in plan scheme, could not become functional. The college maintains all its accounts with State Bank of India, Ramrajatala branch. Fees collection from the students and salary disbursement started through SBI from 07,06,03 and January 2007 respectively.

PART II: EVALUATIVE REPORT

CRITERION I: CURRICULAR ASPECTS

LI Curriculum Design and Development

1.1.1 The vision of the college lies in providing quality higher education to fulfill

the higher educational aspirations of the wards of the people of Santragachi area

of Howrah district in West Bengal. The vision is also to provide with

employability for the undergraduate students of the college comprising mostly

local people.

The mission of the institution is to provide with employability for the students

through the introduction of a few short-term job- oriented programmes in a

multifaculty college. Most of the students come to college either on foot or on

bicycle. The college is situated in a semi-urban area with very little civic

amenities. That is why, the college has also to take up plans to provide for civic

amenities like the construction of drainage and sewerage from its front gate with

NSS assistance. The programmes offered are in general conformity with the

mission and goals. Access to higher education for local students of all ages and

stages of development is ensured by multi-entry points in both the undergraduate

degree college affiliated to the University of Calcutta and in the Netaji Subhas

Open University Study Centre of the college.

At the time of initiation, a course or a programme relating to academic matters is

put for general discussion before the joint forum of teaching, non-teaching staff

and students. In the next stage, the various sub-committees discuss the matters

threadbare before forwarding them to the college governing body for resolution.

The Teachers' Council helps in its implementation. Resolutions in relation to administrative and financial matters are discussed and finalized in the governing body itself. Therefore, the *mission* of the college is communicated through governing body resolutions as it is the highest decision making body.

1.1.2 The mission statement is reflected in the introduction of six career-oriented programmes sanctioned by UGC with effect from July 2005. These are-

#### (A) Arts and Social Sciences-

(i)Communicative English (ii) Tourism and Travel Management (iii) Interior Decoration and Beautification.

#### (B) Commerce-

(i)Computer Applications (Data Care Management) (ii) E-Commerce

(iii)Alternative Banking.

These 3 year add- on courses are meant to provide students with professional skills. No student turned out for admission in E-commerce and Alternative Banking though the college authority made timely announcements for the same.

The West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training,
Government of West Bengal has awarded the college with three vocational
courses consisting of:

(i) Computer Applications (ii) Automobile Mechanics (iii) Taxation Practices.
These have become effective from July 2006. No student turned out for admission in Taxation Practices.

The Information Technology unit of the BCom. Department, headed by the Principal and three other teachers, offers counselling to the graduating college students in obtaining placements. Such as:

- The college has entered into an agreement on 12.02.2009 with Retail

  Career of Kolkata 700107 to impart industry-based education to the
  students. In addition, as an associate of the college, Retail Career would
  create the platform where students can interact with industry (vide letter
  dated 12.02.2009 from its centre director to Principal of the college). Retail

  Career has already sent four students of the vocational streams for On-the Job-Training to Pantaloons.
- Vedant Bajaj and Ambuja Realty have issued appointment letters to a few pass outs of Automobile Mechanic and Interior Decoration and Beautification respectively, on the initiative of the college authority.
- The Vidyasagar School of Management Studies has selected nine students through campus interview on 12.01.2009 for immediate placements.
- On the initiative of the counselling cell, around twelve students passing out of this college in the years 2003-04 and 2004-05, have been given placements in different companies. Names of such students are:-
- (a) In the <u>Arts</u> stream Sujoy Karmakar, Sunny Palit and Mahidul Sardar passing out during academic session 2004-2005 (b) In the <u>Commerce</u> stream Tapas Kumar Chattopadhyay, Pranab Patra, Amit De, Abhisek Bera, Ashoke Maity, Anirban Mitra, Anirban Seal passing out during academic session 2004-2005 and Buddhadeb Ghosh passing out during academic session 2003-2004.

In the absence of a Public Relations Officer or the Dean of Students or a Placement Officer a glossary of information or data regarding employment of students is being provided partially.

The mission statement addresses the needs of the society in conducting time bound Extension Programmes catering to the society. The first phase of the UGC sponsored Computer Awareness Programme was held from 20.02.2006 to 27.02.2006. Teachers of Baxarah High School, a part-time teacher and a non-teaching staff of this college attended it. There were a total number of thirteen participants. The college also received a grant of Rs.24,463 from the UGC for the primary education of slum children towards the scheme 10th Plan College Development, Extention Activities. Ten part-time teachers of the college held the classes from 01.06.2006 to 15.06.2006. A Health Camp was held in the college on 06.01.2009 under the supervision of Dr. Partha Pratim Pal, Hony. Secretary, Indian Medical Association, Howrah Branch. Girl students from the neighbouring Bhanumati Girls' High School and Kedarnath Institution for Girls participated in the programme. The college students and teachers took part in the camp.

The mission statement addresses the institution's traditions only partially. Due to the lack of government aid, the placement cell cannot become operative. Moreover, fewer students have enrolled for the UGC approved add-on programmes, as they are not certified by a university. In this connection, it may be stated that the University of Calcutta and the Vidyasagar University have denied certification for these programmes.

The mission statement addresses the institution's value orientation in its striving to eliminate educational backwardness in an area that is predominantly industrial. As such, the Remedial Coaching Scheme under UGC assistance, for the educationally backward students (SC/ST/ minorities) of the college was implemented during the financial year 2008-2009. A total grant of Rs.1,75,000/was utilized for the coaching of 103 backward students. Also, catering to the needs of the girl students, the college is the only one in Howrah district to construct a women's hostel with financial assistance from UGC. The hostel would provide accommodation to girl students coming from remote areas.

1.1.3 Keeping pace with the changing demands of the changing society and changing times, the college has been striving to introduce dynamism in the conventional disciplines. The college unit of the Netaji Subhas Open University Study Centre has been functioning since June 2003. It has a wide range of programme options like:

- Post Graduation in Bengali, English, ELT, Political Science, Social Work, Public Administration, History, Education, Mathematics, Library Science and Commerce.
- Bachelor Degree Programme (BDP) Honours in Bengali, English, Political Science, History, Commerce and Geography.
- Bachelor Preparatory Programme (BPP)
- Certificate Courses in Human Rights and Pre-Primary Teachers Training.
- Diploma Course in Journalism and Mass Communication; BLIS and MLIS.

With a large number of student enrolment, the NSOU Study Centre primarily caters to needs of dropouts from mainstream academics, women and homemakers.

## The Relevance of the Curriculum to the Students and Society-

- The academic programmes have become more meaningful to the academically backward by the implementation of the UGC sponsored Remedial Coaching Scheme in the academic session 2008-09 with a total grant of Rs. 1,75,000/-
- Equity is ensured in providing free-ship and half free-ship to the economically backward students. The Principal has given personal sponsorship to two students in the current academic session.
  - The curriculum provides for self-development through the UGC add-on programme Interior Decoration and Beautification where the learner receives entrepreneurial skills.
- There is provision for community development in the curriculum in the organization of health camps for staff and students of the college and students of the local schools. One such health camp was held on 06.01.2009. A second project on community development is the literacy drive for slum children under the UGC 10<sup>th</sup> Plan College Development Fund, Extension Activities organized in the college from 01.06.2006 to 15.06.2006.
- The college curriculum has its focus on ecology and environment as well. The NSS wing of the college undertook a drive on 27.02.2007 for college cleaning and on 17.07.2007 for planting saplings on college campus as part

- of extension activities. The students and teachers actively participated in the programmes.
- Regarding value based education, the college organizes a regular number of lectures per week on matters of spirituality by eminent persons of the society. The Vivekananda Yuva Maha Mandal, Ramrajatala Branch held the first spiritual class on 14.03.2009 from 11am to 12.30pm. Shri Avijit Ghosh, Joint Director, Department of Labour delivered the first lecture. The second class was held on 28.03.2009.
- The curriculum is generative of employment. Quite a large number of students have found employment in non-government and private schools as teachers. Quite a number of graduates have found employment in the fields of music and fine arts. In the absence of the position of a placement officer, the current data cannot be provided.
- Information and Communication Technology has been introduced in the following areas of functioning. The figures indicate the number of computers installed in each area.
  - 1. College office 04
  - 2. Principal's office -01
  - 3. Library 01
  - 4. Library reading room 01
  - 5. Geography laboratory -02
  - Information Technology laboratory for BCom students. 10

- With a view to catering to the national demands, the curriculum looks forward to the introduction of the scheme of mid-day meals for APL and BPL card - holders.
- 1.1.4 The curriculum does not have a provision for the inclusion of ICT.

## 1.1.5 Curriculum Design and Development -

- ✓ The initiatives of the institution towards curriculum design and development are reflected in a number of programmes undertaken from time to time. A few of these are:
  - All the departments put up colourful wall magazines annually.
  - Some classes are held with power-point presentations.
  - Departments organize seminars/ debates on syllabus related topics.
  - Teachers of most of the departments participate in syllabus reorientation workshops organized by Calcuta University.
  - Prof. Swati Mustaphi, of the English department has contributed a few questions to Calcutta University Model Question bank for English Honours Part III examinations.
  - Prof. Sipra Ganguly, of the Philosophy department is a paper setter for Calcutta University undergraduate examinations.
  - Prof. Keshab Chandra Khanra, of the Bengali department is a paper setter for Calcutta University undergraduate examinations.
  - The college organized a series of Teacher Exchange Programmes on topics relating to the syllabus with Joypur Panchanan Roy College,

Howrah in January 2009 in English, Bengali, Education, History and Philosophy.

- Permanent teachers of the departments of English, Commerce and Political Science have availed of UGC Minor Research Project Grants. The final utilization certificate for the MRP in English was submitted to UGC in May 2007. The Minor Research Projects in Commerce and Political Science have not yet been completed, and submissions of the final utilization certificates are pending.
- The college is preparing a project proposal on Innovative Education to be submitted for UGC approval very shortly.
- The University of Calcutta has increased the intake capacity of the Honours subjects of the college because of heavy student pressure for admission for B.A/ B.Com First Year. The increased number was for English -25, Geography -15 in 2007 and for Education, History, Political Science -50 each, Commerce -75, Bengali -75, Philosophy -40 in 2008.
- The college authority's endeavour to organize a parents- teachers
  meeting in the academic session 2007-2008 was futile due to students'
  unrest. However, the teachers of the English department organized a
  parents-teachers meeting on 15.01.2009 for the first year Honours
  students, which was well attended.
- The college is the Howrah District Unit of the Institute of Folklore and Cultural Studies. The Institute has the following Registration Number:

WBBIL/2007/20156. The institute and the college unit jointly engage in organizing research oriented activities and seminars in the college. They have completed a research on Jari workers of Howrah. The research outcomes are published in Loukik.

- The development of information database in the curriculum is done by teachers of the English and Bengali departments who make their own teaching plans with the help of power - point presentations.
- ✓ The institution has taken initiatives towards the process of curriculum development in the installation of 10 computers in the IT laboratory, 2 computers in the Geography department with GIS package, 1 computer for student use in the library, LCD screen, overhead projector, 1 computer in the digital classroom and reprographic facilities.
- ✓ Feedback on teachers' performances is obtained from third year and second year BA/BCom students in the NAAC prescribed proforma. The feedback received has been reviewed in the Academic Sub-Committee meeting.

#### 1.2 Academic Flexibility

1.2.1 The range of programme options available to learners in terms of:

#### (a) Degrees:

- 3- year degree course in Commerce (honours and general)
- 3-year degree course in Arts (honours and general) in the following subjects- English, Bengali, Education, Geography, History, Political Science and Philosophy.

- 3-year degree course in Biological Sciences (general) in the following subjects- Botany, Zoology, Physiology. The B.Sc. (general) stream was given affiliation by the Calcutta University in the academic session 2007-08. Students have been admitted to this programme of study in 2008-09.
- 3- year honours course in Business Administration (BBA).

The University of Calcutta has given approval to all the Degree Programmes.

#### (b) Certificates:

- 1. UGC sponsored career- oriented programmes in:
- Communicative English II) Interior Decoration and Beautification
- III) Travel and Tourism IV) Computer Applications
- V) E-Commerce
- VI) Alternative Banking.
- 2. Vocational Courses affiliated to WB State Council of Vocational Education and Training, Government of West Bengal, in:
- I) Automobile Mechanics II) Computer Applications. III) Tax Practices These are 2- year certificate programmes.

#### (c) Diplomas:

The six add-on programmes under UGC are 3- year advanced diploma courses. For the current academic session, 2008-09 only Interior Decoration has five (5) students enrolled for the advanced diploma.

## 1.2.2 (a) Core Options:

- Honours in Arts in the 7 subjects listed above.
- Honours in Commerce and Business Administration.

## (b) Elective Options:

Seven Arts subjects listed above, Commerce and Botany, Zoology, Physiology in the Biological Sciences stream.

- (c) Add-on Courses: 6 UGC add-on courses listed above.
- (d) Interdisciplinary courses are not offered by the college.
- (e) The Calcutta University admission procedures do not allow for flexibility in terms of students' movement from one discipline to the other.
- (f) Time frame is flexible with relation to the completion of a course. Students under the 2+1 system are eligible to appear under 1+1+1 system of examinations under the Calcutta University revised regulations for admissions 2008.
- 1.2.3. Facilities for international students are not provided by the college.
- 1.2.4. The college offers 3- year Bachelor of Business Administration honours affiliated to Calcutta University as the only self-financed programme. Students were admitted to this programme in the batch of 2003-2004. Monthly fees is Rs. 2500/-. The college appoints teachers to this programme based on UGC stipulated qualifications for appointment to the post of lecturers at a monthly salary of Rs. 8000/-. The intake capacity is 30 students per year. The admission procedure comprises of academic records, personal interview and group discussion. The course structure is divided into 6 semesters and is of 2000 marks. The first 4 semesters consist of 12 core papers. In the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semesters, a student moves into specialization.

## 1.3 Feedback on Curriculum

1.3.1 The students' performance in the Calcutta University examinations is reflective of the effectiveness of the curriculum in terms of course content and teaching methodology. The college has recorded a high success rate of over 95% in the Arts and Commerce streams over the last five years. The students' performance record has emerged as a viable method of obtaining feedback on the curriculum. Besides this, the college authority has obtained feedback from the students and other stakeholders in the NAAC prescribed proforma for the academic session 2008-09.

1.3.2 The feedback has been communicated to the respective departments by the college authority.

#### 1.4 Curriculum Update

1.4.1 The syllabus revision is made on the basis of the curriculum changes made by Calcutta University from time to time. The University has made a series of revisions in the undergraduate syllabus from the academic session 2008-09. The syllabi of most of the honours programmes have undergone major changes during the last two years. The details of syllabi changes are available in the syllabi booklet published by the University. A summary of the syllabi for the subjects taught in the college is made available to the students in the college prospectus at the time of admission. It is to be noted that for each Honours subject, PartII examinations comprise papers 1&2, PartII examinations comprise papers 3&4 and PartIII examinations comprise papers 5, 6, 7& 8.

The changes in the syllabi for Honours in English, Education, Geography, Commerce, Philosophy, History and Political Science since the academic session 2006-2007 are detailed below-

PAPER 7- Renamed Educational Technology and Curriculum. PAPER 8-Group

A consists of Comparative Education and Group B consists of a Practical paper

1.4.2 The college ensures that the curriculum bears a thrust on core values adopted by NAAC by the introduction of a wide range of programme options from core subjects to self-financing and vocational courses.

1.4.3. The college adheres to the guidelines set by the UGC, Calcutta University and the State Council of Higher Education in adopting and developing the curricula.

1.4.4 The undergraduate curriculum is modified to meet the emerging national trends in the introduction of a compulsory paper of 100 marks in Environmental Studies by a Supreme Court order. The college has future proposals for starting Post-Graduation programmes in Distance Education under Vidyasagar University in English, Bengali, History, Political Science, Education and Environmental Science.

#### 1.5 Best Practices in Curricular Aspects

1.5.1 The quality sustenance and quality enhancement measures adopted by the college over the last five years are publication of a research journal by the English department, publication of wall magazines by all the departments, organizing of seminars and debates in the departments and holding of frequent class tests.

1.5.2 The best practices adopted in curriculum implementation lie in planning the curriculum into modular form at the beginning of the academic session. The entire syllabus is reorganized into mid-term tests and annual examination from the academic session 2009-10

Recommendations of the Visiting Peer Team in the Previous Assessment Report and Follow-up Action Taken by the College:

Appropriateness of opening a few science departments is examined.
 The college has started the undergraduate programme under the University of Calcutta in Zoology, Botany and Physiology (general stream) from the academic session 2008-09.

Other Quality Sustenance and Enhancement Measures Undertaken by the College since the Previous Assessment and Accreditation in 2004-

- The University of Calcutta has given affiliation to Honours courses in Philosophy and Geography.
- 2. Six UGC add-on programmes have been initiated.

- The West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training has given affiliation to two certificate courses viz. Automobile Mechanic and Computer Applications.

## CRITERION II: TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION

## 2.1 Admission Process and Student Profile

- 2.1.1 (a) To ensure wide publicity to the admission process the college publishes its prospectus annually, at the beginning of the academic year. A sub-committee comprising all permanent teachers revises the prospectus according to fresh admission related guidelines issued by Calcutta University. The rules regarding admission in the academic session 2008-09 are enumerated in page number 18 of the prospectus. The details of the curriculum are laid down in pages 8,9 and 10 of the same prospectus.
- (b) The college website has been launched in the academic session 2008-09. The official website address is www.drklbcollege.com. It contains the minimum critical information as per format received from the Principal Adviser, Government of India, Planning Commission, New Delhi in November 2008 through UGC (ERO). The website contains information about students' admission regarding courses offered in the regular and career-oriented programmes, fees structure and the admission form.
- (c) The college does not have an extra budgetary allocation to publicize its admission process through advertisements in newspapers.
- (d) The advertisements for admission to various courses in the college are displayed on college notice boards alone. The intake capacity for the various programmes of study being limited, all the seats generally get filled - up before the entire admission process is closed.

2.1.2 (a) The University of Calcutta has published the following regulations for admission to the three - year B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com.(Honours, General and Major) courses of study under 1+1+1 system of examinations 2008. These have been made effective from the academic session 2008-09.

For admission to the Honours courses, the minimum marks to be obtained by a candidate in the Higher Secondary Examinations are 500/250 in the aggregate and 90/45 in the desired subject or 110/55 in the desired subject. A candidate has to secure 50% marks in the aggregate when he/she has not studied the subject in his/her Higher Secondary Examinations provided all other clauses are satisfied. For SC and ST candidates desirous of taking admission to the honours courses, the minimum qualifying marks is 40% of the aggregate or 40% in the subject under consideration in the Higher Secondary Examination.

The candidate is also required to pass in English having full marks not less than 100 in the Higher Secondary Examinations. For determining eligibility for admission to the Honours Course, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top - four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/ Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.

A candidate who secures a minimum of 45% marks in the aggregate at the H.S.(10+2) or equivalent examination shall be eligible for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. **Degree Course** of studies provided he/she has passed in English having full marks not being less than 100.

The college strictly adheres to the CU norms for admission of candidates to the first year of studies. The honours courses have seen a sharp rise in the intake capacity as enumerated in the previous chapter. The college sticks to a deadline for issue of forms and the submission of filled- in forms. Next, the forms are scrutinized and a merit list prepared. The college introduced a written admission test of 50 marks for admission to English Honours from the academic session 2008-09. In view of the success in conducting the written admission test, the college plans to conduct such tests in more subjects in the near future.

There is a low demand for admission to the General Degree courses. The admission process is kept open so long as the seats do not get filled up.

- (b) The college does not offer professional courses due to the lack of infrastructure.
- (c) Admission to the vocational courses is done on a first- come- first served basis. The vocational courses being in low demand, seats are not filled - up as well.
- 2.1.3 To ensure transparency in the admission process, the Admission Sub-Committee meets at least twice in an academic session. It is constituted of the Principal, all the teachers and the non-teaching staff of the college. The first meeting of the Admission Sub Committee is held to discuss the eligibility criteria for admission and to fix deadlines for the issue of forms, receiving filled-in forms, publication of merit lists and finally the dates of taking admission. The criteria for admission are made known to the guardians, students, non-teaching

staff and the governing body. The college proceeds with the admission process only when there is no objection from its stakeholders.

- 2.1.4. Promoting access to ensure equity among the following category of students, the college proposes to implement such programmes as-
- (a) Students from disadvantaged community. The College does not have the means of promoting equity among the APL and BPL card holders. There is the provision for relaxation of taition fees for a few such students.
- (b) Women-There is no provision for ensuring equity among women since it is a co-educational college. With UGC assistance, there is a women's hostel on the campus. Seats are lying vacant in the hostel with no application for occupancy
- (c) Differently-abled The college does not have special provisions for the reservation for students with disabilities from the academic session 2009-2010 vide circular dated 26.11.2008 from the Secretary, Council for Undergraduate Studies, Calcutta University. This circular ensues from the letter no. 745/Com dated 31.07.2008 from the Assistant Commissioner (Disabilities). West Bengal differently abled. However, the college would have to provide for a requiring such follow-up action.
- norms for reservation of seats at the time of admission for the SC, ST and Minorities at 22%, 7.5% and 3% respectively. There is a College -level Standing Committee for the Welfare of SC/ST/ OBC communities formed on 13.09,2002 (d) Economically weaker sections- The college follows the Central Government on the recommendation of the Deputy Registrar, BCW Cell, Calcutta University

in his letter dated 27,08,2002 to all affiliating colleges. The tenure of the Committee is 3 years. It consists of 10 members as per recommendations, including the Principal of the college.

- (e) Sports personnel There are no seat reservations for sports personnel at the time of admission since the college has not yet received applications from sports people competing at the district, state or the national levels.
- (f) In order to maintain transparency in the admission process, recommendations at the time of admission are not encouraged.

## 2.2 Catering to Diverse Needs

22.1 To assess the students' knowledge and skills before the commencement of the programme, the college initiated the process of a written admission test for the 25 seats in English Honours in the academic session 2008-09. In all, there were 116 applicants, of which, 86 applicants appeared for the test. Two teachers of the department, Prof Swati Mustaphi and Prof. Saranya Sen set a 50 marks question paper of 1- hour duration comprising objective and subjective questions on English Literature. The test was held on 18.06.2008 from 12 noon to 1 pm with the assistance of the Department of English, the Principal, the permanent and temporary teachers and staff of the college. The first, second and third merit lists Teachers in the rest of the departments, engage themselves in informal students' counselling prior to the distribution of forms for admission. A large number of students come from the economically backward sections of society. The UGC programme would indeed help in their economic upliftment thereby benefitting society largely. The proposal is yet to receive approval from UGC. 2.2.5 The college is not equipped to cater to the needs of the differently abled.

Students' appraisals of teachers are taken note of by the college Governing Body. The teachers are given professional counselling for improving their performances. The college follows the self-appraisal method to evaluate the performance of teachers.

2.4.1 The <u>permanent teachers</u> are appointed as per recommendations made by the West Bengal College Service Commission. In the Department of Education, Prof. Sm Sampa Ray Bagchi was appointed as lecturer in May 2005 against a vacancy in the general category. In the Department of Bengali, Prof Dr. Mantu Biswas was appointed as lecturer in May 2005 against a vacancy in the SC category. In the

Department of Geography, Prof Sm Sutapa Pal was appointed as lecturer in July 2008 against a vacancy in the OBC category.

The part-time teachers are appointed on the basis of the panel of teachers created by a Selection Committee as per CU circular No.C/9001/Cir dated 14.11.05. The Selection Committee comprises of a subject expert from Calcutta University, the college Principal, an external member of the Governing Body and a permanent teacher of the concerned Department. All appointments to the posts of part-time teachers on and from 01.07.2005 in the colleges are to be made from amongst candidates having at least 55% marks at the Post-Graduate level in the subject concerned. Four such appointments were made in the year 2008. They are-i)in the Department of English, Prof. Saranya Sen joined as part-time lecturer on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2008;

- ii) in the Department of Physiology, Prof. Dhruba Kumar Sautya joined as parttime lecturer in July 2008.
- iii) in the Department of Zoology, Prof. Sreeparna Kuthe joined as part-time lecturer in July 2008.
- iv) in the Department of Botany , Prof. Suma Dey joined as part-time lecturer in July 2008.

The college does not have the required number of teachers to handle the courses.

The deficiency in the number of classes is filled up by taking extra classes and by allocating a sufficient number of classes under the UGC Remedial Coaching Scheme 2008.

- 2.4.2 A part-time instructor with BCA was appointed in 2005 to take the practical classes in Information technology for the B.Com students.
- 2.4.3 The management encourages the professional development of the faculty in encouraging them for availing research grants from the UGC, sanctioning study leave and deputing them to participate in Management Development Programme / workshops / seminars etc. Some of the achievements of the faculty are enumerated below-

- 2.4.4 The faculty has not received any awards/recognitions during the last 5 years.
- 2.4.5 Training programmes organized by the college for the professional improvement of the faculty consist of (i) a UGC sponsored Computer Awareness Programme held from 20.02.2006 to 27.02.2006 which was attended by Prof. Kakali Ganguly, part-time lecturer in the Department of Geography and (ii) training of the departmental teachers in the GIS software installed in the Geography laboratory. So far, the college has not been able to organize training programmes for internet -use, use of audio-visual aids and material development of multi-media etc.

### 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 For class tests, mid-term tests and college tests, the corrected answer scripts are shown to the students and necessary guidance for improvement are given by the teachers. Performances in each test are discussed in the Teachers' Council meetings.

The permanent teachers evaluate answer scripts for Honours and General papers for Calcutta University examinations as per Statutory requirements. It is mandatory for teachers of the Departments of English and Bengali to take up assignments as examiners for Compulsory English and Bengali respectively at CU Part 1 examinations. At CU examinations, the part-time teachers take up assignments as examiners in the General papers.

- 2.5.2 The progress of the students is communicated to their parents in the parents-teachers meetings. The parents-teachers meeting held on 18.08.2007 was unsuccessful due to students' unrest. The English department successfully organized a parents-teachers meeting on 15.01.2009 for the first year Honours class to appraise the parents/guardians about their wards' performances.
- 2.5.3 There has been no grievance regarding the method of evaluation within the college. A candidate appearing at the Calcutta University examinations may apply for a review of answer scripts if he is dissatisfied with his marks published by the University.
- 2.5.4 Reforms relating to syllabi or evaluation methods are initiated by Calcutta University. Teachers attend workshops conducted by CU time to time to apprise themselves of the changes. The altered methodology is communicated to the students later on.

### 2.6 Best Practices in Teaching-Learning Process

2.6.1 The college is gradually trying to initiate the students to participate in interactive method of learning. The lecture method is being supplemented by issue-based / topical discussions. The students would be encouraged to attend a sizeable number of classes in the digital classroom. In many departments, the lecture method is supplemented with subject specific debates, seminars/discussions and extempore presentations.

Recommendations of the Visiting Peer Team in the Previous Assessment Report and Follow-up Action Taken by the College:

- A few more full time teachers, to be deployed judiciously among different departments, be appointed.
  - Two permanent teachers in the departments of Education and Bengali were appointed on the recommendation of the West Bengal College Service Commission in May 2005. One permanent teacher in the department of Geography was appointed in July 2008 on the recommendation of the West Bengal College Service Commission.
- 2. Teachers may build up linkages with concerned University departments and other centres of higher learning and research to update their knowledge as well as keep up with the latest trends in teaching and learning.
  The management has not been able to provide teachers with the infrastructure
  - The management has not been able to provide teachers with the infrastructure or a relaxation in the teaching schedule to build up such linkages.
- Teachers may use teaching aids like maps, charts, graphs and use electronic aids like Overhead Projectors, LCD (displays), cassettes, CDs etc to make

classroom teaching more interesting, effective and participative. In specific subjects, study materials on recent developments in the field of study may be provided to the students.

In many departments, teachers have taken classes through power-point presentations in the newly installed Digital Classroom.

 Advanced learners may be given special coaching and exposure to strive well for competitive examinations.

The management has not been able to provide special incentives to the advanced learners.

 Feasibility of a coaching centre with UGC assistance for above purpose may be considered.

The college does not have a coaching centre for these purposes.

- Wider use of computer and internet by teachers and students is encouraged.
   The teachers would gradually be introduced to the frequent use of internet facilities only when more computers are installed.
- 7. As more than 65% of the students of the college are girls, separate women specific courses like embroidery, tailoring, textile designing, food processing etc. can be offered as short - term courses during the evening hours.

The college does not have women - specific courses.

Other Quality Sustenance and Enhancement Measures Undertaken by the College since the Previous Assessment and Accreditation in 2004 -

- The introduction of teaching plan in the departments of English, Geography, Bengali and Botany.
- Classes on value-based education have been introduced in the academic session 2008-09.
- iii) The college website has introduced in the academic session 2008-09. It has since been updated once in February 2009.
- iv) The process of an admission entrance test has been introduced in English in the present academic session (2008-09). In the present session, admission in the rest of the departments has been taken through publication of merit lists. This has been possible because a large number of students applied for these programmes.
- v) The government nominee in the Governing Body has done the assessment of the teachers of the college in the proforma prescribed by NAAC.

### CRITERION III: RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION

### 3.1 Promotion of Research

- 3.1.1 The college does not have a committee to facilitate and monitor research activity. This is because the college is primarily an undergraduate degree college without the congenial environment for research and suffering from a number of infrastructural lacunae.
- 3.1.2 The college has sanctioned study leave for six-weeks as per Calcutta University statutes to Dr. Mantu Biswas of the Bengali Department to submit his PhD thesis in August 2006.
- 3.1.3 The institutional budget does not have a provision for research and development.
- 3.1.4 The college does not promote the participation of students in research activities.
- 3.1.5 There are no major research facilities developed on campus.
- 3.1.6 The college is the Howrah District Unit of the Institute of Folklore and Cultural Studies. The journal of the Institute called Loukik has the following Registration Number: WBBIL/2007/20156. The institute and the college unit jointly engage in organizing research oriented activities and seminars in the college. They have completed a research on Jari workers of Howrah. The research outcomes are published in Loukik.

### 3.2 Research and Publication Output

3.2.1 The college does not have the infrastructural facilities for research guidance.

- Prof. Saranya Sen, part-time lecturer in the Department of English is working on his MPhil dissertation as a regular scholar at the Department of English, Calcutta University. The topic of his thesis is: Narrative of the Nation: A Study of Chinua Achebe's Fictions.

### COMPLETED MPHIL THESIS (NON SPONSORED)

Prof Gopa Das, part-time lecturer in the Department of Education obtained the degree of Master of Philosophy from the Netaji Subhas Open University in December 2006. - 3.2.3 The Minor Research Projects are directed towards highlighting new areas of knowledge in the various disciplines.
- 3.2.4 The faculty does not have research papers published in referred journals.

### 3.3 Consultancy

- 3.3.1 Dr. Prabir Kumar Sanki, part-time lecturer in the department of Commerce, is a tax consultant.
- 3.3.2 The available expertise is publicized for internal purposes only.
- 3.3.3 The tax consultant is paid nominal fees for his services.
- 3.3.4 There is generally no revenue generated from the tax consultancy work.

### 3.4 Extension Activities

- 3.4.1 The faculty and students of the college actively participate in the extension activity projects taken-up by the NSS from to time.
- a) The NSS unit of the college responded to the call of collecting donations for the Tsunami victims The unit collected Rs 2051/- and sent it to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund on 06.04.2005.
- b) The NSS unit of the college undertook the task of cleaning the college on 27.02.2007

- c) The NSS observed Tree Plantation Day on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2007 to observe World Environment Day.
- d) The NSS observed Van Mahotsava Week from 1st July 2007 to 7th July 2007.
- e) On 17,7,2007, the NSS undertook a drive for planting saplings on college campus to improve ecological balance in the locality. The programme for Environment Enrichment and Conservation would also help in enhancing campus beautification.
- The NSS observes Republic Day and Independence Day with reverence every year.
- g) The NSS observed 24th September 2007 as NSS Day.
- h) An AIDS Awareness Programme was observed by the NSS on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2008.
- i) The NSS activities aimed at environment enrichment are organized under the sub-theme of "Youth for Better Environment". One such activity would include the construction and maintenance of the streets and drains of the locality so as to keep the environment clean. The NSS wing of the college would assist the Howrah Municipal Corporation in constructing a drain from the main gate of the college to the southern limit of its boundary wall in the current session. The NSS, Calcutta University has given a grant of Rs 15,000/- to the college for conducting the compulsory Special Camp for the session 2008-09. The college authority had convened a meeting on 26.01.2009 with its stakeholders to discuss the technicalities of the construction of the drainage system.

The NSS has a Programme Officer as per Calcutta University guidelines.

A Health Camp was held in the college on 06.01.2009 under the supervision of Dr. Partha Pratim Pal, Hony. Secretary, Indian Medical Association, Howrah Branch. Girl students from the neighbouring Bhanumati Girls' High School and Kedarnath Institution for Girls participated in the programme. The college students and teachers took part in the camp.

The National Integration Seal for Rel/- was purchased by students of the college. A total amount of Rs.1000/- was sent to the National Foundation for Communal Harmony, New Delhi in January 2006.

A seminar on Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practices was held in the college on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2006 in collaboration with the Department of Consumer Affairs, Government of West Bengal.

The college organized a seminar on World Consumer Rights' Day on 20th March, 2009 in collaboration with the Department of Consumer Affairs and Fair Business Practices, Government of West Bengal. The seminar, aimed at creating consumer awareness, was followed by a play on consumer rights. The staff, students and the local people attended it.

- 3.4.2 The college has organized a few outreach programmes with financial help from the UGC and Ministry of Youth and Parliamentary Affairs. These are-
- a) The college utilized Rs 24,463/- for the primary education of slum children from 01.06.2006 to 15.06.2006. During the Xth Plan (2002-2007), UGC had sanctioned a total amount of Rs. 34,680 to the college for extension activities. The UGC sanctioned Rs.21, 180/-{vide letter no. W2-044/02-03 (ERO) dated 23.10.2007} for the Literacy Programme for Slum Area Children. In all, 36

slum children participated in the programme. They were given books and refreshments at UGC expenses. Nine part-time teachers and the coordinator held the classes. They were paid remuneration from the UGC allocated fund.

b) As part of arousing awareness for Parliamentary procedures, the college participated in the tenth State Level Youth Parliament Competition organized by the Ministry of Youth and Parliamentary Affairs, Government of West Bengal at Salt Lake Stadium on 26.07.2007. Teachers of the Department of Political Science were the programme coordinators. Eight Students from various departments of the college participated in the programme. The college secured the first place at the regional level and the third place in the state level.

Twenty-four students of the college alongwith three teachers of the Department of Political Science visited the West Bengal Assembly and witnessed its proceedings on 16.03.2009. The Deputy Speaker in Syed Nausher Ali Hall (council chamber), Assembly House briefed them at 10 am on 16.03.2009.

c) The students of First Year Bengali Honours participated in an educational tour of the ancestral house of renowned novelist Saratchandra Chatterjee on 20.02.2009. Five teachers accompanied thirty students to Samtaber in Howrah District, the place where Saratchandra Chatterjee's ancestral house is located. The tour was of particular interest to the students since the Government of West Bengal had recently declared Saratchandra Chatterjee's ancestral house as a heritage building.

- 3.4.3 The institution does not have a college neighborhood network
- 3.4.4 The institution does not have partnerships with NGOs etc.
- 3.4.5. The college has extended its helping hand for the benefit of the local community. The first phase of the UGC sponsored Computer Awareness Programme was held from 20.02.2006 to 27.02.2006 under the Xth Plan College Development Programme, Extension Activities. Seven teachers of Baxarah High School, a part-time teacher of the Geography Department and a non-teaching staff of this college attended it. There were a total number of thirteen participants. Sri Sumalay De, Computer Instructor was appointed trainer for the programme. The college received a total grant of Rs.5710/- for the purpose of conducting the computer awareness programme. The classes were held from 11am to 5pm for fifteen days. The UGC allocated fund was utilized to pay remuneration to the resource person, print study materials, arrange for refreshments for the participants, payment of coordinator's fees and to distribute soft copies of the class lectures.

As a result of the college's partnership with the Vidyasagar School of Management studies, nine students were selected for placements through a campus interview on 12.01.2009.

- 3.4.6 The college does not have an institution-community networking.
- 3.4.7 The faculty has not received or recognitions for extension activities.

#### 3.5 Collaborations

3.5.1 The college has entered into an agreement on 12.02.2009 with Retail Career of Kolkata 700107 to impart industry-based education to the students. In addition, as an associate of the college, Retail Career would create the platform where students can interact with industry (vide letter dated 12.02.2009 from its centre director to Principal of the college). Retail Career has already sent four students of the vocational streams for On-the -Job-Training to Pantaloons.

The Vidyasagar School of Management Studies selected nine students for placements through a campus interview on 12.01.2009.

- 3.5.2. Retail Career, as an associate of the college has selected four candidates for on-the-job training at Pantaloons with a stipend of Rs 1300/-pm.
- 3.5.3 The college does not have a MoU with other academic institutions.

### 3.6. Best Practices in Research, Consultancy and Extension

The college is primarily an undergraduate degree college. Here some of the faculty members possess MPhil and PhD degrees. However, the research skills of the faculty cannot be utilized for guiding research projects. With a few departments not enjoying their full faculty strength, the teachers are constrained to involve themselves in direct teaching for a larger share of their schedules. Teachers can involve themselves in research only when a few post- graduate departments are opened either in the undergraduate degree college or in the Distance Education Programme under Vidyasagar University.

This newly established institution is endeavouring hard to build on its potentials and reach certain goals like setting up of academic research programmes and establishing consultancy services. For this, more resources, both infrastructural and human need to be generated and optimized utilization of their potentials required.

Recommendations of the Visiting Peer Team in the Previous Assessment Report:

 Some arrangements should be made for the regular health check up of the students.

A Health Camp with the assistance of the Indian Medical Association, Howrah Branch was organized in the college premises on 06.01.2009. College students and staff and girl students from the neighbouring schools benefitted from the camp.

 Teachers are advised to submit more number of subject based and locality based research proposals to funding agencies like UGC, ICSSR etc.

The Senior Lecturer in the Department of English has completed a Minor Research Project in May 2007. The permanent teachers of the Departments of Commerce and Political Science have also availed of Minor Research Project grants.

3. Teachers may subscribe to the membership of professional bodies. They should be encouraged to publish articles in professional journals. The college may think of bringing out one research journal annually incorporating the research articles of the faculties of different disciplines.

Though few teachers have publications in seminar proceedings and research oriented magazines, more number of publications are expected in professional
journals. The college has not been able to bring out a research journal
incorporating the articles of the faculties.

4. Commerce and BBA departments may take initiatives for consultancy work.

A part-time teacher in the Department of Commerce is a tax consultant.

Other Quality Sustenance and Enhancement Measures Undertaken by the College since the Previous Assessment and Accreditation in 2004 -

- (i) The college has opened up a few PG departments in the NSOU Study Centre. Proposals are made to open up a few more PG departments under the distance education programme of the Vidyasagar University. Opening of postgraduate departments would open up the possibilities for research in an undergraduate degree college.
- (ii) The college has entered into research collaboration with the Institute of Folklore and Cultural Studies. Three meetings on 23.8.2008, 13.12.2008 and 07.03.2009 have been held so far. This collaboration would help in fostering the research ambience of the college.

## CRITERION IV: INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

### 4.1 Physical Facilities

- 4.1.1 The physical facilities available for -
- (a) Academic activities: There has been a perceptible increase in the number of classrooms during the last five years. The size and the number of classrooms and laboratories are adequate for the needs now.

The college has a moderately equipped computerized library.

A computer laboratory with internet facilities has been installed.

- (b) Co-curricular activities- A 16 station multi-gym has been installed out of a grant of Rs 2.70 lakhs sanctioned by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, New Delhi. The letter from the Under Secretary, Government of India, dated 10th September, 2004 sanctions the said amount for the purchase of sports equipments. The grant has been utilized by the college for purchase of specific nonconsumable sports equipments from the approved sports dealers who are on the rate contract of SAI, New Delhi. The college has also to maintain a register of assets in the prescribed form. Accordingly, the multi-gym has been installed to enhance the body fitness of the students. The students are allowed to use this gym against a nominal fee. Any student showing outstanding performance at the state/district/national level meets, would be given free access to the gym. The multi-gym facilities are available to the students from the academic session 2005-2006.
- (c) Extra -curricular activities and sports- The college has a table tennis board and 4 carom boards for students' use.

The Annual College Social is held by hiring the auditorium at Sarat Sadan, Howrah. The Students' Union of the college organized the Annual Social of the college at Sarat Sadan on 15.03. 2006, for the academic session 2005-06. The Students' Union of the college organized the Annual Social of the college at Sarat Sadan on 6.12. 2006, for the academic session 2006-07.

The Annual Sports Day was held in the year 2004-05, 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2008-9 by hiring a playground in the locality.

The intra-college cultural competitions, celebrations of Netaji's birth anniversary,

Tagore's birth anniversary, Republic Day and Independence Day are held in the


college seminar hall located in the Sudharani Women's Hostel.

The college observed the 150<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day of the University of Calcutta on 24<sup>th</sup> January, 2006 at the college seminar hall. The Principal hoisted the University flag. Teachers and non-teaching staff observed the occasion by singing the University song, Subho Karmo Pathe Karo Nirbhayo Gaan composed by Rabindranath Tagore.

The college observes International Mother Language Day each on 21st February 2006. Different speakers place their views on the significance of the day.

- 4.1.2 The Master Plan of the college campus is enclosed.
- 4.1.3 The college has substantially augmented its infrastructure to keep pace with its academic growth. The engineers of Howrah Improvement Trust construct the buildings.

The details of the installations in the Geography Laboratory are as follows:

- c) Image Classification- Supervised and Unsupervised.

- Adding attribute data for Query and Statistics.
- g) Preparation of Charts, Regression Graph and embedding on map.
- h) Map projection, Geo -referencing and Geo-coding of tables.
- i) Thematic Map- Choropleth, Sphere Diagram & Dot Density.
- j) Terrain Analysis- Isopleth, Slope and 3D visualization.
- k) Reduced/Enlarged print with scale and legend.
- l) Exhaustive Help and Tutorial.

The Biological Sciences Laboratories are constructed out of college funds.

The 3 laboratories were formally inaugurated on 19.07,2007. The instruments installed in the Zoology Laboratory are worth Rs.69,375/-, those installed in the Physiology Laboratory are worth Rs. 71,300/- and those installed in the Botany Laboratory amount to Rs.1,31,636/-. Each laboratory has furniture worth Rs.1 lakh. There has been recurring expenditure for the purchase of books, providing for seminal libraries and gas connections.

The Automobile Mechanic Workshop has a diesel engine Indica V2 and a petrol engine Maruti 800. A wielding section and a carpentry section are subsidiaries attached to the Workshop.

The Digital Classroom has the following the following items:

- a desktop computer Rs. 19000/-
- LCD screen- Rs.48000/-
- Overhead projector Rs.15000/-
- White screen 2500/-
- Xerox copier machine Rs.50000/-
- \$ 50 Chairs Rs.50000/-

The Digital Classroom is furnished with lights worth Rs11000/-, almirah worth Rs6000/-, window screen worth Rs 5000/-, tiles worth Rs 50000/-.

The expenses for the above items in the Digital Classroom are borne out of college fund.

The facilities provided in these buildings are:

Annexe Building I- It has 2 classrooms, a teachers' room, college office, CU

Zonal Centre, students' union room, students' toilet and a guards' room with

attached toilet.

Annexe Building II- It has 2 classrooms, a boys' common room and 1 hall. The hall is used as a classroom in the day section and as the Automobile Mechanic Workshop in the morning section. The Science Block consists of 5 laboratories viz. IT, Geography, Zoology, Physiology and Botany, 1 classroom, teachers' room, 3 toilet blocks in each floor and NSOU office.

4.1.4 The college provides for separate common rooms for boys and girls students.

There is a separate rest room for the women staff in the Sudharani Women's Hostel.

- 4.1.5 In order to ensure that the available infrastructure is optimally utilized, the building sub-committee prepares building plans with the Howrah Improvement Trust. The details of such Plan projections are-
- i) Women's Hostel Phase II- UGC XIth Plan grants.
- ii)Sudharani Women's Hostel top floor- college funds.
- iii)Annexe Building II top floor- college funds.
- iv) Science Block top floor college funds.
- 4.1.6 The college does not have special infrastructural facilities for the differently-abled students.

#### 4.2 Maintenance of Infrastructure

- 4.2.1 The budget allocation for the maintenance of the following items for the year 2007-2008:
- a) Building- Rs.1,30,863/-
- b) Furniture- Rs.15,000/-
- c) Computer Work- Rs.2000/- (sundry expenses).

- 4.2.2 In reality, college account bears no surplus budget. What is noticed in the printed accounts as surplus of income over expenditure is the resultant effect of temporary transfer of amounts of different items both to income and expenditure side of the account to carry out different activities of the college.
- 4.2.3 The college appoints listed contractors for the maintenance and repair of the following items:
- a) Xerox machine- An agreement with Aircon Communications to maintain the Canon Digital Photocopier Model: iR2016, Sl. No.KRJ 05410 with network printer purchased on 27.11.2006. The TG (total guarantee charge), Rs.0.45p, which includes service, spares, toner and drum, has started from 28.11.2007.
- b) Computers- An agreement with Blue Planet Computers dated 12.05.2008 for Software Modification and Yearly maintenance.@ Rs.2000/-pm ( Yearly Rupees Twenty Four Thousand only). They are also the providers of the Student Management and Financial Accounting Software.
- An agreement with Service Media for the annual maintenance of 4 computers @

  Rs.800 X 4 = Rs.3200/- per year. (These include 3 computers in the college office

  and 1 computer in the Principal's office).
- c) Aqua Guard water purifiers- An agreement with Eureka Forbes for biennial maintenance of 4 Aqua Guard water purifiers.
- d) Sound Systems and Telecommunication An Annual Maintenance Contract of Rs.3500/- with M.R. Enterprise 68 B, S.N. Banerjee Road, Kolkata-700014.

- e) Building The college insured its property viz. computer, gym items, building, furniture, fixture and fittings covering fire and burglary with The Oriental Insurance Company Ltd. in July 2005 at a premium of Rs. 4414/-
- f) I Panasonic FAX Machine An Annual Maintenance Contract of Rs1500/-(excluding spare parts) with M.R. Enterprise 68 B, S.N. Banerjee Road, Kolkata-700014 with effect from 03.01.2008.
- g) Plumbing- An annual maintenance contract of Rs.2000/- with Mullik Plumber, GIP Colony, Howrah for the year 2009-10.
- h) Furniture- An agreement with Samanta Cabinet for the annual maintenance of furniture at market rate.

### 4.3 Library as a Learning Resource

4.3.1 The college has a library sub-committee comprising the Principal, 5 permanent teachers, 1 non-teaching staff and the library clerk. The State Government has not yet created the post of the Assistant Librarian.

The library sub-committee maintains a resolution book on the approval of the Governing Body. The functions of the library sub-committee are-

- a) To seek requisition from teachers for purchases in the library which include books, periodicals, journals, and computer software and internet connection.
- b)To take final decision on the various purchases according to requisition. The college receives very limited grants from various sources. The UGC disburses the single library grant in one Five-Year Plan in 4 installments. The State Government disburses grants for the library generally once in a year. The NSOU

has given a book grant of Rs.10000/- to the college in 2008-09. In November 2008, the MHRD, CIIL has books worth Rs,3993/- to the Department of Bengali.

- c) The vendors are allowed to supply books at a discount of 15%.
- d) For fixed items like book- cases, computer software and hardware, the library sub-committee makes purchases through open tender. The tender is notified in the college notice boards.

For computer peripherals etc. the purchase committee makes direct purchases as and when required.

4.3.2 The college library is at present a closed access library. Students are made aware of the author and title index through the library catalogue, which is computerized. The students are allowed lending and reading facilities. Two books are issued for 15 days at a time. The library insurance has not been introduced. Separate appointments of a security guard and a library guard have been made. The non-teaching staff apply pesticides to the library books at regular intervals.

4.3.3 The college library has one computer for storing data. One more computer with broadband of 100mbps is installed for the use of the students. The library provides for reprographic facilities for the students.

4.3.4 The Departments prepare fresh booklists whenever requisitions are sought.
The following is the statement of the total amount spent on new books and journals from 01.05.2004 to 22.01.2009.

This list is inclusive of the book grant received from the NSOU and CIIL in 2008-2009. An annual subscription of Rs.50/- made by each student of the college at the time of admission creates the College Library Fund.

- 4.3.5 The students have access to the internet in the library.
- 4.3.6 The library services are computerized. The students can view the catalogues in the computer. Books are issued to the students through the computer. Students have access to the internet in the library computer.
- 4.3.7. The college has an annual institutional membership of British Council whereby it is entitled to 10 login IDs for access to online resources.
- 4.3.8 A new arrival stock is displayed in the library to enrich the faculty and students with the latest acquisitions.
- 4.3.9 As an institutional member of the British Council, the college is issued 11 Membership Cards and a complimentary DVD Movie Card and is entitled to the following:
- 20 books and 10 periodicals for three weeks
- 2 Educational and Training CDs for 1 week
- 2 DVD movies for 1 week
- 10 login IDs for access to online resources
- Library access for all the teachers of the college
- The books/periodicals/training CDs/ DVD films can be reissued on the phone/e-mail for an additional equivalent period.

The annual fee charged by the Council for the above services is Rs.6000/-.

- 4.3.10 The library does not have special facilities for the visually- and physically challenged persons.
- 4.3.11 The infrastructural development of the library over the last two years are-
- i) purchase of almirah -11
- ii) purchase of computers- 1 ( Pentium 4 processor, UPS and printer).
- iii) purchase of fans .
- iv) purchase of chairs.
- 4.3.12 The library subscribes to the Employment News and the Karmashetra (a Bengali weekly) to acquaint the students about employment advertisements. The college is a daily subscriber to the English daily The Times Of India, and two Bengali dailies, Anandabazar Partika and Samvad Pratidin.

#### 4.4 ICT as Learning Resources

- 4.4.1 The college has up-to-date computer facility. The details on the available hardware and software are-

- e) 3 computers in the college office and 1 computer in the college library are connected by LAN with the Server in the Principal's Office.
- 4.4.2 The college has a central computing facility. 4 computers (nodes) are attached with 1 server.
- 4.4.3 Computer-aided teaching is generally not followed in the college. The IT section of the B.Com Department and the Department of Geography has separate computers with relevant software as specified by the curriculum.
- 4.4.4 The college website as specified in chapter II of the present report was launched in the academic session 2008-09. IMPACT inc., 4, Sadananda Road, 2nd Floor, Kolkata-700026, launched the website. The first updating of the website was done on 14.02.2009.
- 4.4.5 Service Media and Blue Planet Computers upgrade the hardware and the software according to the annual maintenance contract.
- 4.4.6 The Annual Maintenance Contract is renewed in each financial year with Service Media for hardware maintenance and with Blue Planet Computers for software maintenance. The IT lab instructor does the daily maintenance.

#### 4.5 Other Facilities

- 4.5.1 a) The women's hostel constructed out of UGC fund can accommodate 85 students as approved by the WB government.
- b) A single girl has not taken admission so far.

- c) The girls' hostel has 12 rooms.
- d) The college has not yet been able to provide with recreational facilities
- e) The college has been able to provide with carom boards, table tennis boards,

chessboards and a multi-gym as part of indoor facilities.

The outdoor games are athletics, cricket and football championships.

f) The college has an institutional membership with the Students' Health Home. For the academic session 2008-09, the college paid Rs 4296/- to the Students' Health Home as institutional fees collected from 1074 students

@ Rs4/- per student.

The college has an agreement with Dr.Bholanath Banerjee, MBBS. with Registration No. 26125 to cater to emergencies.

  She was placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 800m run in the State meet at Yuva Bharati
  Krirangan in 2007-08.
- Tania Hazra represented Calcutta University in the North-East Zone All-India University Volleyball Tournament held at Barelli and Kannur. The Calcutta University team secured 4<sup>th</sup> position in the Zonal Tournament.

- Tania Hazra participated as player in the 11<sup>th</sup> Youth National Volleyball Championship held at Angamal, Kerala in 2008-09.
- Tania Hazra participated as player in the 34<sup>th</sup> Junior National Volleyball Championship in 2008-09 held at Nagpur, Maharashtra. Her team secured the 2<sup>nd</sup> position.
- 4.5.3 The college provides the following facilities for the staff and students:
- There are 2 staff rooms, one each for the teaching and non-teaching staff.
- There are 2 separate common rooms for the girl and boy students.
- There is a rest room for the ladies adjoining the Women's hostel.
- There is a guest room in the Women's hostel.
- There is provision for vehicle parking and a cycle stand.
- · The college has a canteen for the staff and students.
- 4 Agua Guard machines are installed for safe drinking water.
- · Intercommunication facilities are available for the use of the staff.
- · Telephones for the use of the staff and students are installed.

#### 4.6 Best Practices in Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The UGC Women's Hostel Special Scheme for the XI <sup>th</sup> Plan has been implemented. The UGC has approved Rs.70, 00,000/- for the construction of a Women's Hostel. Rs.35, 00,000/- is sanctioned vide UGC letter no WHW-074/06-07 dated 19.01.2009. Besides the present hostel, the upcoming building would have all modern facilities to meet the demands of the rising number of students. The women's hostel constructed in the IXth Plan period comprises classrooms, the college library and a seminar hall for students' use. The hostel is

used for academic and not for residential purposes because of the lack of classrooms. Also, no application for occupancy has yet been received. The present building would be used as a hostel when the building under UGC XI plan scheme would start functioning.

### Recommendations of the Visiting Peer Team in the Previous Assessment Report:

Infrastructure improvement and augmentation may be taken up with urgency.
 The college should arrange to provide more indoor and outdoor sports facilities to both boys and girls.

A Sixteen (16) station multi-gym facility has been provided for the fitness of the staff and students. The Annual Sports are held in either of the three hired playgrounds viz. Sankar Math, Adarsha Sangha and Bharat Mata grounds.

The women's hostel should start functioning.

The permanent positions of the cook and helper have been sanctioned recently.

The hostel would start functioning only when there were applicants for occupancy in the hostel.

3. The two vocational courses namely "Interior Decoration and Decoration" and "Travel and Tourism Management" should have papers on computer applications.

The two courses have papers on computer applications.

4. The library may be networked with other libraries, e.g. National Library, the University Library, to facilitate inter-library borrowings. Link up with INFLIBNET be actively considered. The college has an institutional membership with the British Council. Link up with INFLIBNET has not been possible as yet.

Other Quality Sustenance and Enhancement Measures Undertaken by the College since the Previous Assessment and Accreditation in 2004 -

- i) Installation of a digital classroom in the academic session 2008-09.
- ii) Installation of a GIS software in the Geography Laboratory.

#### 5.2 Student Support

Prospectus annually. The prospectus contains details regarding the courses offered, academic calendar, the fee structure, rules and regulations regarding admissions, college and university examinations, academic progress of the college and the faculty list. A committee comprising teachers of the college updates the prospectus annually. Prof Saranya Sen, part-time lecturer in English, wrote down the English version of the prospectus publicized in the academic session 2008-09. The college publishes a Newsletter annually. It contains details regarding the policies and programmes of the college already implemented. The newsletter records the chronological progress of the college. A newsletter sub-committee, comprising permanent teachers, is in charge of the newsletter publication. Prof

Sampa Ray Bagchi, Lecturer in Education is in charge of data collection. Prof Swali Mustaphi Senior Lecturer in English does the compilation work.

- 5.2.2 The college provides for half free-ship to 10% of the total number of students admitted each year. At present 89 students are enjoying half free-ship. The following students are the recipients of the various scholarships based on the marks obtained in the Calcutta University examinations:

5.2.3 The college runs a canteen but it is not subsidized.

- The college has sent a proposal for Rs 3 lakhs to UGC for setting up a Cell for Career Counselling during the XI th Plan period.
- 5.2.4 The college does not have provisions for overseas students.
- 5.2.5 The Information Technology unit of the BCom. Department, headed by the Principal and three other teachers, offers counselling to the graduating college students in obtaining placements. Such as:
- The college has entered into an agreement on 12.02.2009 with Retail Career of Kolkata 700107 to impart industry-based education to the students. In addition, as

an associate of the college, Retail Career would create the platform where students can interact with industry (vide letter dated 12.02.2009 from its centre director to Principal of the college). Retail Career has already sent four students of the vocational streams for On-the -Job-Training to Pantaloons Kolkata. These four students are (i) Sanchita Banerjee (ii) Sovan Ghosh (iii) Souren Mondal and (iv) Aniran Adak

Vedant Bajaj and Ambuja Realty have issued appointment letters to a few pass outs of Automobile Mechanic and Interior Decoration and Beautification respectively, on the initiative of the college authority.

The Vidyasagar School of Management Studies has selected nine students through campus interview on 12.01.2009 for immediate placements.

Students of Interior Decoration and Beautification, the UGC add-on course, are trained in entrepreneurial skills.

- 5.2.7 Teachers of the Interior Decoration and Beautification, Automobile Mechanics and Commerce courses take personal initiative in the counselling of the students.
- 5.2.8 The college does not have a special centre for the guidance and counselling of girl students.
- 5.2.9 The college does not have a cell for prevention against sexual harassment of women students. All grievances are redressed in the Grievance Redressal Cell constituted under the UGC guidelines.
- 5.2.10 The college governing body in its resolution no. MiscE, dated 27.9.2002 named the 8 members of the Grievance Redressal Cell as per Calcutta University guidelines. It consisted of a GB nominee, three permanent teachers, employees union Secretary, students' union Secretary, Controller of Examinations CU and Inspector of Colleges CU.

Following the resolution of the college governing body as enumerated above, the Grievance Redressal Cell was restructured as per UGC guidelines in March 2008. It now consists of a GB nominee, two permanent teachers, TC Secretary, employees' union Secretary, one member of the employees' union and one nonteaching GB member. The Grievance Redressal Cell has been constituted to address the students' grievances regarding academic and administrative matters. There is a record of demands for an increased number of classes, a cycle stand, common rooms for boys and girls and spacious canteen.

- 5.2.11 The curriculum for the following courses provides for acquiring computer skills:
- a) BCom Honours and General students.
- b) Geography Honours and General students.
- c) Computer Applications (UGC add-on course) the current academic session has 02 students for the certificate course.
- d) Computer Applications course under the WB State Council of Vocational Education and Training has 20 students enrolled for the current academic session. The faculty is qualified to teach these courses. The appointment of the IT laboratory instructor was approved by the nodal authority viz. Engineering Institute for Junior Executives, MB Road, Dalalpukur, Howrah-4.
- 5.2.12 The UGC add-on course in Communicative English with 03 students in the academic session 2007-08 in the certificate programme, provides for personality development.

The Youth Parliament competitions held from time to time and the environmental awareness programmes undertaken by the NSS aim at creating good citizens.

- 5.2.13 The college ensures safety and security of its students, faculty and assets by (a) deploying hired security staff duly sanctioned by the governing body;
- (b) appointing permanent day guard and night guard;

- 5.3.4 The Students' Union formed in 2001-02 functioned till 2006-07 session. The students' union is defunct by the order of the District Magistrate, Howrah from the academic session 2007-09. In Resolution No7 of the Governing Body meeting dated 03.12.2008 it was decided that the students' union election would remain suspended due to deterioration in the law and order situation in the college. The District Magistrate, Howrah, had instructed the college Governing Body in his letter dated 10.01.2008 not to carry on with the process of holding the election till the law and order situation improved. The Inspector of Colleges, Calcutta University, in his letter dated 22.1.2008 had requested the Principal to take legal

measures for the smooth running of the college and that Calcutta University would extend its full support and cooperation in this respect.

- 5.3.5 Four sub-committees of the college having academic and administrative functions have students' representatives on them-
- a) The Admission Sub-Committee: The students' representative monitors the process of ensuring transparency in the admission process. In the academic session 2008-09, it was possible to conduct a written examination for English Honours and to publish merit lists for other subjects because of the absence of the students' union.
- b) The Finance Sub-Committee: The students' representative looks into student related agenda like canteen facilities, construction of cycle stands, students' union and common room facilities.
- c) The Cultural Sub-Committee: The students' representative recommends names of the participants for the intra-college cultural competitions and the Annual College Social.
- d)The Sports Sub-Committee: The students' representative recommends names of the participants for the intra-college and inter-college sports competitions.
- 5.3.6 The college does not have a strong mechanism to obtain data and feedback from its graduates to improve the growth and development of the college.

# 5.6 Best Practices in Student Support and Progression

5.6.1 The college has adopted certain best practices towards Student Support and Progression: a) Deployment of professional security guards at the college premises on regular basis for the security of students especially girls.

b) The college has received a two-time grant from UGC for the construction of two women's hostels, one during the IXth Plan period and the other during the Xlth Plan period.

c) The college has submitted a Proposal to UGC for the construction of toilet facilities for women amounting Rs2,24,000/- during XIth Plan period.

Recommendations of the Visiting Peer Team in the Previous Assessment Report and Follow-up Action Taken by the College:

No recommendations were made under the head, Student Support and Progression.

Other Quality Sustenance and Enhancement Measures Undertaken by the College since the Previous Assessment and Accreditation in 2004 -

- All the students have been given printed identity cards.
- Few teachers along with the Principal of the college offer counselling to the students regarding their placements. This service is voluntary in nature.
- iii) A library reading room and internet facilities for the students has been introduced.
- The students have been provided with spacious library facilities.
- v) Prasanna Kumar Lahiri and Baradakanta Sanyal endowment has been introduced for the student who scores the highest marks in English Honours at the CU examinations.

- The Students have been provided with an air-conditioned information technology laboratory.
- The students can availof the subsidized Xerox facilities.
- The college newsletter is being published continuously recording the chronological progress of the college.

# CHAPTERVI: GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP

6.1 Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 Vision- The vision of the college lies in providing quality higher education fulfill the higher educational aspirations of the wards of the people of the Santragachi area of Howrah district in West Bengal. The vision is also to provide with employability for the undergraduate students of the college comprising mostly local people.

Mission- i) A job-oriented multi faculty college has since been created and proper training to the learners is being imparted by experienced faculty personnel.

- ii) To impart a sense of discipline, to imbibe the spirit of respect for motherland and love for the people of the country with the eye to develop good conscience among the learners.
- iii) To be able to become an employable graduate, college is imparting training on different aspects, which may promote the students to catch jobs of variegated natures.
- a) Periodical watch is being made by the college to see whether national policy of education and employment vis-s -vis training imparted by this college in this respect synchronize or not and corrective measures wherever and whenever necessary is taken in no less period.
- b) The vision of the college has become successful to the expected level because of-
- (i) The six UGC add-on courses.

(ii) The vocational courses run under the WB State Council of Technical education.

(iii) The Short Term Vocational Training programmes of six months' duration.

The STVT courses are temporarily non-functional because of the Travel and Tourism Management and Interior Decoration and Beautification courses being run under the UGC add-on programmes.

Further, placement agencies like Retail Career and Vidyasagar School of Management have been invited to provide placement training to the graduating students of the college.

the management ensures that a class routine is framed following the Calcutta University Statutes and UGC guidelines regarding the number of class hours. The day college is run between 10 am and 4 pm. To make the teaching - learning process more effective, the college library and the Geography laboratory are equipped with the advanced software. Moreover, the Information Technology laboratory has 10 computers. The state of the art laboratories of the Biological Sciences stream cater to the changing demands of the curriculum. The management would also motivate teachers having less than 5 years of experience to acquire classroom skills as per UGC XI Plan guidelines. The management would also implement the UGC XI Plan guidelines for enhancement of competence building among teachers to make the teaching-learning-evaluation process more effective.

- 6.1.3 Responsibilities are defined and communicated to the staff of the college
- (a) Academic Council meetings;
- (b) Teachers' Council meetings;
- (c) Governing Body meetings;
- (d) Joint Council meetings
- 6.1.4 The various sub-committees deliberate on the issues relating to admission. registration, examination, building, library etc. in relation to the information received from the higher administrative bodies like the Director of Public Instructions, Calcutta University, University Grants Commission and The West Bengal College Service Commission. The sub-committees take appropriate resolutions that are later on approved by the Governing Body. For the smooth functioning of administration, the Principal takes an active role to ensure that the teachers and non-teaching staff perform their duties properly.
- 6.1.5 The management supports the involvement of the faculty and staff for the improvement of the effectiveness and efficiency of the institutional processes in a number of ways:
- Teachers are sanctioned study leave to attend Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses, seminars, workshops etc.
- Prof Kakali Ganguly, part-time lecturer in Geography and Shri Kinkar Ghosh, non-teaching staff attended the UGC sponsored Computer Awareness Programme in the college from 20.2.2006 to 27.2.2006.

- As coordinator of the college NSS unit. Prof Mantu Biswas attended the Orientation Programmes of the NSS twice at Narendrapur Lokshiksha Parishad.
- In the Department of English, Prof Swati Mustaphi Senior Lecturer was sanctioned study leave to attend the Management Development Programme at the Indian Institute of Management, Calcutta on Excellence in Higher Education from 4th August to 6th August 2008.
- In the Department of English, Prof Saranya Sen, part-time lecturer is pursuing the MPhil programme in English at Calcutta University. His class routine has been re-adjusted accordingly.
- The management has encouraged the publication of research journal by the students of the Department of English.
- The management ensured the successful conduct of a written admission test in the Department of English in the academic session 2008-09.
- The Department of English successfully conducted the parents-teachers meeting for First Year Honours students on 15.1.2009.
- Prof Mantu Biswas was sanctioned 3 weeks study leave before confirmation
  of his service for the submission of his Phd thesis in August 2006.
- Prof Mantu Biswas is the Programme Officer of the NSS and the convener of the Seminar Sub-Committee.
- Prof Keshab Chandra Khanra Selection Grade Lecturer in the Department of Bengali visited Joypur Panchanan Roy College, Howrah on 19.1.2009 as part of a teacher exchange programme.

- prof Khanra was the coordinator of the UGC programme for the primary education of slum children run in the college from 01.6.2006 to 15.6.2006
- Prof Khanra is the coordinator of the NSOU study centre of the college.
- The part time teachers of the Department of Geography have been given training by the management in the GIS software package.
- The part time teachers of the Department of Geography have taken extra classes for the students on enhanced remuneration.
- The Department of Geography has organized two departmental seminars one on Disaster Management in September 2005 and the other on Remote Sensing and GIS in January 2009.
- The Department of Geography conducts field tours successfully as part of the curriculum.
- In 2008, the Screening Committee duly constituted as per Calcutta University guidelines selected one part-time teacher in the Department of English and three part-time teachers in the Departments of Botany, Zoology and Physiology.
- Classes for Botany, Zoology and Physiology begin at 8.30 am daily.
- The Department of Physiology organized the Health Camp on 6.1.2009.
- The Departments of Botany, Zoology and Physiology conducted educational tours of the Indian Botanic Garden, Alipore Zoological Gardens and Birla Institute of Technology respectively in January-February 2009.
- All the Biological Sciences departments have seminal libraries

- The library assistant is being encouraged to acquaint herself with the library software package installed by Blue Planet Computers.
- The library catalogue is available for students' use in the computer installed for the purpose.
- To facilitate teaching and research, the college has obtained an institutional membership of the British Council library @ Rs 6000/- per year.
- The management is contemplating the appointment of a librarian on contractual basis with knowledge of Library Science.

6.1.6 The Principal is the chief coordinator between the (a) students and guardians and (ii) teachers and non-teaching staff. He executes the decisions of the governing body. He upholds the spirit of the governing body in implementing the vision and mission of the college. He maintains liaison between the college and all regulatory bodies viz. - 6.2.2 The process of administration is decentralized to a certain extent:
- a) Teachers are given academic freedom regarding the purchase of books and journals.
- b) The seniormost teacher maintains academic and administrative discipline in the absence of the Principal.
- c) The Principal appoints a centre-in-charge among the permanent teachers to conduct the Calcutta University examinations in the college. This appointment is duly intimated to the CU authorities each year.
- d) The placement/ promotion of two permanent teachers of Political Science and Commerce were made effective immediately without awaiting a GB meeting.

- c) principal allows the Departmental Heads to conduct seminars and debates at the expenses of the college.
- 6.2.3 Principal coordinates with the seniormost teacher to conduct the daily affairs.
- 6.2.4 The college does not have a Grievance Redressal Cell for its employees. The faculty vents its grievances in the Teachers' Council. The non-teaching staff vent their grievances through their union.
- 6.2.5 The sub-committee meetings are held with the purpose of discussing specific issues relating to administration:
- a) The Admission Sub-Committee meets before the start of the admission process.
- b) Meetings of the Finance Sub-Committee and the Building Sub-Committee are held whenever necessary.
- c) The Election Sub-Committee met 5 times last year.
- d) The Examination Sub-Committee meets before the commencement of the internal and external examinations.

The major issues discussed in the last meeting of the Governing Body dated 03.12.2008-

- a) The suspension of students' union elections as per DM's orders.
- b) Initiation of the process of reaccreditation of the college.
- c) Initiation of the Silver Jubilee Celebrations of the college.
- d) Decision to install the statues of Dr Kanailal Bhattacharyya and Sudhir Kumar Ghosh, donor, taken.

6.2.6 The college does not have a cell to prevent the sexual harassment of women staff. There is a Grievance Redressal Cell to address such issues.

# 6.3 Strategy Development and Deployment

6.3.1 The perspective institutional plan in relation to the academic and infrastructural process:

Academic Planning-

- a) The Digital Classroom is devised to benefit all subjects.
- b) The college Prospectus (English and Bengali version) is restructured under two teachers according to the latest Calcutta University guidelines.
- c) The Prospectus for the academic session 2009-10 would contain the syllabus outline for all the subjects taught at the undergraduate level.
- d) All departments would prepare annual teaching plans before the commencement of classes.
- e) Teachers would be encouraged to use of audio-visual aids in teaching.
- f) A cell for career counselling would be constituted with assistance from UGC.
- g) Students would be accompanied to places of historical interest to imbibe knowledge about their national heritage.

Infrastructural Planning-

- a) A grant of Rs 70,00,000/- has been approved in the UGC XIth Plan period for the construction of a women's hostel.
- b) A proposal for the construction of a ladies' toilet has been placed before UGC during the XI Plan period.

- c) A proposal for Rs 8,00,000/- has been submitted to UGC for the construction of classroom and examination building.
- 6.3.2 The objectives of the college are enumerated in the meetings of the various sub-committees mentioned earlier in 6.2.1
- 6.3.3 The sub-committees are the same as those enumerated in 6.2.1 above.
- 6.3.4 The college does not have an MIS in operation.
- 6.3.5 The Governing Body in its meeting dated 11.12.2008 discussed the performance of the permanent teachers in relation to their attendance in college and the total number of classes taken.

The attendance of the non-teaching staff was also recorded. The permanent teaching and non-teaching staff are dissuaded from taking unauthorized leave.

- 6.3.6 The college promotes the sharing of knowledge and empowerment of the faculty in a number of ways-
- a) Three teachers have availed of Minor Research Project grants.
- b) Departments conduct their own seminars and workshops.
- c) A permanent teacher functions as the officer-in-charge of the Calcutta University and college examinations.
- d) The Information Technology laboratory has 10 computers for students' and faculty use.
- e) The college organizes one state-level seminar each year.
- f) All the departments put up colourful wall magazines every year.
- g) A college magazine is published annually.

- h) Teachers of the college do collaborative research with the Institute of Folklore and Cultural Studies.
- Teachers attend workshops relating to NAAC, CU syllabus changes, CU examination Zonal Centres, NSS and NSOU activities.

### 6.4 Human Resource Management

6.4.1 Teachers maintain an annual Self Appraisal Report as per UGC guidelines.

Teachers are considered for promotion/placement based on a weighted average of the marks obtained along 5 parameters.

The Performance Appraisal Report is not maintained in the case of the Nonteaching staff.

The college Governing Body considers when a promotion would be given to suitable candidates.

According to the government GO dated 26.11.2007, promotion from Group D to

Group C would be given whenever a vacancy arises. Accordingly, Shri

Dhananjoy Manna was elevated from the position of clerk to that of cashier.

Shri Amar Bag was promoted as head clerk.

Shri Amar Bag and Shri Dhananjoy Manna are promoted as upper division clerks.

6.4.2 The office staff contributes a monthly premium of Rs 79/- towards Group Insurance LIC savings scheme.

The staff has participated in various computer awareness programmes.

The staff would be encouraged to participate in UGC Listed Staff Amelioration Programmes. the management has announced a reward of Rs 100/- for the staff showing efficiency in running remedial classes. However, no one has been found suitable

so far.

prof Srabani Dey has been sanctioned 135 days of maternity leave in 2008 as part of staff well-being.

6.4.3 The Zoology laboratory assistant and the Geography laboratory assistant are appointed in the Group D category. The management is trying to absorb them even though they are over-age, through appeals to the Ministry of Higher Education and the Judiciary.

The college receives recommendations from the West Bengal College Service Commission for appointment of teachers on substantive basis.

created by a Selection Committee as per CU circular No.C/9001/Cir dated 14.11.05. The Selection Committee comprises of a subject expert from Calcutta University, the college Principal, an external member of the Governing Body and a permanent teacher of the concerned Department. All appointments to the posts of part-time teachers on and from 01.07.2005 in the colleges are to be made from amongst candidates having at least 55% marks at the Post-Graduate level in the subject concerned. The college advertises vacancies for part-time positions in the AnandaBazar Patrika and The Statesman. The governing body prescribes the format of the appointment letter for part-time teachers. As per government rules, a part-time teacher is required to take 8 classes per week. The present college requires the part-time teacher to take 12 classes per week. A part-time teacher is

paid Rs 4000/- per month as remuneration. The college bears 50% share of the total remuneration paid to 20 part-time teachers at present. The State Government bears the other 50% of their remuneration.

6.4.5 This criterion is not applicable for the present situation.

6.4.6 The college has conducted one UGC sponsored Computer Awareness programme in February 2006 for the skill up-gradation of the staff.

6.4.7 A UGC grant of Rs 70, 00,000/- has been approved for the construction of a state of the art college building of five floors.

#### 6.5 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.5.1 The details of the financial support received from the Government are enumerated in Chapter IV of the present report.

The building grants received since 2005 -

Rajya Sabha MP grant of Rs 18,24,413/- received in 2005 for the construction of Annexe I, building.

UGC Xth Plan building grant of Rs 3,81,480/- received in 2006 for the construction of Annexe II building.

DPI, Government of West Bengal building grant of Rs 8,06,951/- received in 2007 for the construction of Annexe II building.

DPI, Government of West Bengal building grant of Rs 6,08,156/- received in 2008 for the construction of the second floor of the Women's Hostel.

UGC Women's Hostel Phase II building grant of Rs 35,00,000/- received in 2008 in the XI th Plan period.

6.5.2 The Government and UGC sanction the bulk of the funds to the college.

6.5.3 There are adequate budgetary resources to fulfill the college's daily expenses.

6.5.4 The statements of income and expenditure is enclosed.

6.5.5 The accounts of the college are audited on an annual basis. An auditor is appointed from the government list of recommended auditors. The students' fees are being collected through State Bank of India, Ramrajatala branch with effect from 07.06.2003. The college has been transferring the salaries of the teaching and non-teaching staff to their savings bank accounts since January 2007.

6.5.6 The college has computerized its finance management systems. The post of a whole-time system analyst is required to provide support to the system.

#### 6.6 Best Practices in Governance and Leadership

6.6.1 This is a growing college with a continuous rise in students' strength. It demands augmentation in infrastructure and learning resources. Accordingly, the management has to spend more time on the development of infrastructure, to seek development grants from the MPLAD programmes, from UGC and the Government. The campus has increased structurally with the implementation of newer project plans.

The management is adopting resolutions to open up new courses, appoint quality teachers and to provide good laboratories.

The teachers and staff cooperate to implement these programmes.

The fixation of pay of the permanent staff and the opening of service books are done within a few months of joining college.

Care is taken to maintain the existing infrastructure.

An internal auditor is appointed to check up all financial transactions viz the collection of tuition fees, collection of other dues from the students, collection of cheques from treasuries vis-a - vis disbursement of amounts on different heads viz payment to college teachers and staff after deduction of TDS and other incidental expenditures.

The State Bank of India, Ramrajatala branch has gifted the college with ten new ceiling fans of Crompton Greaves make in January 2007.

### Recommendations of the Visiting Peer Team in the Previous Assessment Report and Follow-up Action Taken by the College:

- i) The college may explore the possibilities of entering into an understanding with some organizations for the training and placement of its BCom and BBA students. The college has entered into an understanding with Retail Career for the training and placement of its students. Other organizations like Vedant Bajaj and the Vidyasagar School of Management Studies have conducted campus interviews and given placements to a few selected candidates.
- ii) Short -term course on Financial Services Marketing may be introduced to exploit the boom condition prevailing in the financial services sector.

The college does not have short-term courses on financial services marketing.

iii) The Alumni Association may be made more active.

The alumni association functions informally. They provide feedbacks on academic programmes. However, the college does not have a complete database of the alumni.

iv) A Parent-Teacher Association also should be formed.

The college has not been able to form the parents-teachers association.

The college may set specific targets that can be attained during next five years A strategic plan to achieve these targets is formulated

The college has been able to set targets for the post-accreditation period (2004-2009). A focused and strategic planning has helped the college to achieve its mission to a large extent during these five years of planning.

Other Quality Sustenance and Enhancement Measures Undertaken by the College since the Previous Assessment and Accreditation in 2004 -

- The DPI's sanction of fund for building construction and purchase of books i) was not available prior to NAAC accreditation. Since 2005, the Government of West Bengal has sanctioned the college with development grants under various schemes.
- The NSS has provided assistance to the management regarding the ii) beautification of the campus.
- The college received approval of appointment of three non-teaching staff in iii) Zoology, Botany and Physiology.
- The DPI sanctioned three permanent posts of teachers in Zoology, Botany iv) and Physiology.
- The second posts in six departments were sanctioned by the DPI, v) Government of West Bengal.
- A grant of Rs 70,00,000/- has been approved for the construction of the second phase of the Women's Hostel under the XI plan scheme.

- Rs.35,00,000/- has been sanctioned for the same purpose during the financial year 2008-09.
- The college is the Zonal Centre for the general papers in Political Science,
  Education and Bengali to assist Calcutta University in the smooth running of
  examinations.
- viii) Proposal for a UGC sponsored National Seminar has been submitted for approval in March 2009.
- ix) The management has given appointment to two permanent staffs of the women's hostel viz a cook and a helper.
- x) The management has appointed a security agency viz Suraksha Security for the safety of the students and staff.
- Promotion/ placement of teachers and staff and their pay fixations is done without any delay leaving no space for grievances.
- xii) The officers -in-charge for Calcutta University examinations are appointed from among the permanent teachers of the college.

## CRITERIONVII: INNOVATIVE PRACTICES

### 7.1 Internal Quality Assurance System

- 7.1.1 The college has adopted certain mechanisms for quality assurance within the existing systems-
- a) A DIGITAL CLASSROOM has been installed in the academic session 2008-09 for participative learning.
- b) Teachers of all disciplines have participated in workshops on curriculum development.
- c) Faculty is engaged in conducting research projects and research publications. The details of such projects and publications are enumerated in ChapterIII.
- d) Faculty has completed a Minor Research Project in English.
- e) The management has taken up a few staff training programmes viz. the UGC sponsored COMPUTER AWARENESS PROGRAMME from 20.02.2006 to 27.02.2006.
- f) Many departments have their own teaching plans.
- g) Faculty would be encouraged to participate in faculty development programmes during the XI th plan period.
- 7.1.2 The college offers financial assistance to departments to carry out their plans and projects:
- a) The Department of English. has published a research journal.
- b) The Department of Geography has conducted a number of field tours each year.

- c) The Departments of Zoology, Botany and Physiology have conducted field c) tours of Alipore Zoological Gardens, Indian Botanic Garden and Birla Institute of Technology respectively in the academic session 2008-09.
- d) The Department of Political Science organized a visit to a session of the West Bengal State Legislative Assembly on 16th March 2009 to acquaint the students with Parliamentary procedures.
- e) The Departments of Geography and Political Science organized departmental workshops on topics related to the curriculum.
- f) All departments publish wall magazines.

Besides bearing expenses for the above, the management follows the UGC criteria for the teaching workload and the number of teaching days during each academic session. The teaching workload for a permanent teacher is 22 to 24 classes per week. A college is expected to maintain 180 teaching days during each academic session (July to June).

- 7.1.3 The students' performances in the Calcutta University examinations is an indicator of the positive role played by them in quality assurance. The academic performances of the students of the current year show a success rate of over 95%.
- 7.1.4 The college organizes mid-term tests, written admission tests, parentsteachers meetings and merit based entrance lists to promote best practices.

To ensure that the best practices have been internalized, the college has introduced a number of endowment scholarships.

The following students are the recipients of the various scholarships based on the marks obtained in the Calcutta University examinations in the academic session 2007-08:

- a) Sivani Das Memorial Scholarship-Milan Samanta (BCom Hons Second Year)

- 7.1.5 This has not been implemented.

#### 7.2 Inclusive Practices

- 7.2.1 a) The socially backward classes are given admission as per government orders.
- b) Merit scholarships are given to support the economically weaker sections of society.
- c) The best practices for the benefit of the differently abled are yet to be implemented.

As determined by the Backward Classes Welfare Department, the staff pattern is maintained at the time of appointment:

7.2.2 Dr Mantu Biswas, Lecturer in the Department of Bengali was appointed against a vacancy in the SC category.

The following vacancies occur in the permanent positions of three departments-

political Science - ST

Education - SC

Botany - SC

Shri Pradip Das, laboratory assistant in the Botany department and Shri Amar Bagh, head clerk were appointed against vacancies in the SC categories.

7.2.3 There is no such gender balance among the students and staff.

Two -time grants for the construction of Women's Hostels (UGC IXth Plan and XI th Plan) have been received to accommodate girl students coming from distant places.

- 7.2.4 A gender-related sensitizing course for the staff and students has not been done.
- 7.2.5 Programmes for the promotion of overall development of students from rural/tribal backgrounds have not been taken so far.
- 7.2.6 The UGC sponsored Remedial Coaching Scheme provides a mechanism to record the incremental academic growth of the students admitted from the disadvantaged sections.
- 7.2.7 The college does not have special policies to promote social-justice and good citizenship among its students.

The inter-college Youth Parliament competitions initiate the students to the responsibilities of good citizenship.

#### 7.3 Stakeholder Relationships

7.3.1 The governing body takes decisions and implements the government's policies on the academic programmes.

- A number of sub-committees viz the Finance Sub-Committee have students' representations on them. This ensures all its stakeholders to participate in the institutions academic and administrative processes.
- 73.2 The new programmes are slotted in a manner so as not to disturb the functioning of the day college.
- 1) The theoretical classes for the Biological Sciences stream are held between 8:30 am and 2:30 pm.
- ii) To maintain the academic hour, the practical classes follow the same routine.
- iii) The vocational classes are held between 7:30 am and 10:30 am.
- iv) Classes at the NSOU study centre are held on Saturdays and Sundays after 1:30 pm.
- 7.3.3 Stakeholder satisfaction is ensured by -
- i) satisfactory students' performance in CU examinations;
- ii) a transparent admission process;
- iii) good public relations between the locals and management.
- 7.3.4 The college promotes sports and other extra-curricular activities. Annual prizes are given to students performing appreciatively well in the intra-college competitions. The college prospectus announces the incentives given to students.
- 7.3.5 The local people and dignitaries visit the college during seminars, Annual Social, annual prize giving ceremony and Saraswati Puja. It is in these occasions that the management discusses concerns with the college's stakeholders and tries to re-structure its policies based on them.

7.3.6 The NSS through its activities promotes the social responsibilities and citizenship roles among the students.

The celebrations of the birthdays of eminent intellectuals viz. Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Rabindranath Tagore and Dr Kanailal Bhattacharyya promote a sense of responsible citizenship among the students.

7.3.7 In order to bring in community - orientation in its activities, the college organized a UGC sponsored Computer Awareness Programme from 20.2.06 to 27.2.06 for the teachers of government-aided schools.

The college undertook the Slum Area Literacy programme under UGC assistance from 01.6.06 to 15.6.06.

The college organized a Health Camp on 06.1.09 under the supervision of the Dr. Partha Pratim Pal, Hony Secretary, Medical Association of India for the college students and girl students of neighbouring Bhanumati Girls High School and Kedarnath Institution for Girls.

7.3.8 With the assistance of the college unit of the NSS, the institution is planning to construct a drain connecting the two drains of the college.

7.3.9 The faculty and the students contribute whole heartedly to all the extension activities of the college.

7.3.10 Classes begin immediately after the completion of Calcutta University examinations. Students demand more teachers in view of their educational needs.
7.3.11 Parents-teachers meetings are organized to enhance students' performances. To meet students' expectations of learning, all the departments prepare colourful wall magazines. The students contribute articles in the college.

magazine. Performance related awards for cultural competitions are given away at the Annual Social of the college.

7.4 Complaints against the management process are redressed in the Grievance Redressal Cell. The Joint Council of all stakeholders and the college governing body take decisions on all complaints.

# THE WAYS IN WHICH THE CORE VALUES OF NAAC ARE REFLECTED IN THE VARIOUS FUNCTIONS OF THE INSTITUTION:

The college's various endeavours reflect the core values of NAAC. The core values need to be internalized, institutionalized and identified with. The college is endeavouring hard to see that students receive the adequate knowledge so that they can find the proper placements for themselves. The college has arranged a few classes on value-based education. A proposal for setting up of a Cell for Career and Counselling has been submitted to UGC during the XI th Plan period. There is a placements' cell in function to counsel the students regarding job placements. The college has also tried hard to implement the recommendations made by the peer-team of NAAC in its on-site visit in 2004. The twenty-two recommendations made for ameliorative purposes have indeed helped the management to steer the institution towards higher academic standards. The IQAC of the college expresses its gratitude to NAAC for its support and guidance at various stages to assist in the accreditation process.

#### EVALUATIVE REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF BENGALI

The Department of Bengali was established in 1985 at the time of first affiliation of the college by University of Calcutta. At first, courses in Compulsory Bengali and Elective Bengali in the B.A. stream was introduced. Bengali honours was introduced in 1998 with 25 seats. It was Herculean task for the teachers- one full time and two part-time to bear with excess class load at that time. But with the full sincerity and devotion, the result was above 95% all the time. The intake capacity of Honors students was increased to 50 in the year 2000. It was increased to 75 in 2008. Dr.Mantu Biswas joined the second post (reserved for SC) in May 2005.

Students fulfilling the minimum eligibility criteria as determined by CU from time to time are given admission to the first year Bengali honours. The honors students of Geography, Philosophy, History, Political Science and Education can opt for Bengali General. Students taking admission in the General Courses can opt for Bengali as a General subject.

Students come from mediocre and poor families of the area and of distant villages. They do not possess sound academic background. So the teachers of the Department take care for the academic improvement of these students. The result of the students in the CU examination is satisfactory.

CU. frames the Syllabus for the honors and General courses. The UG council of the University changes it from time to time. The drop-out rate of the admitted students is 5% to 10% in average. Library facilities are easily available to the students. The college library has 1616 books for the use of the students of Bengali. Some relevant audio-CDs are used for the academic interest of the students. Teachers are very cooperative towards the students' necessities providing books, journals and study materials. The First and Second Year students of the department publish wall magazines of the department separately each year. The department organizes educational tours from time to time. A teacher exchange programme was organized with Joypur Panchanan Roy College, Howrah in the current academic session. Teachers of the department attend state - level and national level seminars organized by other colleges and Universities. There is no formal placement cell. Guidance is given to the students to provide services to the public sector, SSC and various competitive examinations. We cherish to introduce PG course in Bengali under CU in the future.

Prof S.Mustaphi was officer-in-charge of Calcutta University PartI Examinations, 2005. She was also the member of the Selection Committee held on 17.12.08 for the appointment of a part-time teacher in the Department. Prof S Mustaphi has a First Class Masters' Diploma in Rabindrasangeet from Bangiya Sangeet Parishad.

Prof. Saranya Sen, part-time lecturer in English joined the Department on 02.01.2008. He did his honors in English from St. Xavier's College under the University of Calcutta in 2005 and his M.A. from the same university in 2007 with a first class. He cleared the State-level Eligibility Test (SET) for lectureship in 2008. Currently he is pursuing M.Phil. Program from the University of Calcutta. He has presented papers in the state level seminars and has written articles in Bengali and English magazines and journals. The students with interest and active interactions attend his classes. Currently the Editor of the journal of the English department, he is significantly contributing to the academic

atmosphere of the institution. The department was established in 1985. The Honours programme was initiated in the academic session 2003-04 with an intake capacity of ten students. The intake capacity for honors was increased to twenty-five from the academic session 2007-08. The department is seriously understaffed and the effect of it can be seen in the form of the added pressure that the existing faculty has to shoulder. Though there is the recommendation of five (5) more full-time teaching posts, the W.B. College Service Commission has not managed to appoint anyone in them so far. At present, two teachers have to cater to around 450 students (Honours and Compulsory English).

The students of the department mainly come passing the Higher Secondary Examination organized by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education. For most of the students, the medium of instruction in school was Bengali, which has left them with immense scope to improve their English language skills as well as their style of English writing. However, to ensure the basic literary and linguistic competence required in an bonors level class, the department has started organizing entrance examinations for the candidates aspiring to take admission. The entrance test was held on 18.6.08. There were 117 applicants for the 25 honors seats. The selected candidates have shown considerable

improvements in the first year of their study as well.
